A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Workgroup to Study Prize-Linked Savings Accounts

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup to Study Prize-Linked Savings Accounts; 4 providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a 5 member of the Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the 6 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to study and make 7 recommendations regarding certain matters relating to prize-linked savings 8 accounts; requiring the Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to 9 the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the 10 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Study Prize-Linked Savings Accounts. 11
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

13 That:

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- 14 (a) There is a Workgroup to Study Prize–Linked Savings Accounts.
- 15 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- 16 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of 17 the Senate:
- 18 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the

19 House;

- 20 (3) one member appointed by the Governor;
- 21 (4) the Director of the State Lottery and Gaming Control Agency, or the 22 Director's designee; and

- 6 (g) The Workgroup may:
- 7 (1) hold public meetings across the State to conduct its duties; and
- 8 (2) invite nationwide experts to testify about prize–linked savings 9 accounts.
- 10 (h) On or before December 31, 2019, the Workgroup shall submit a report on its 11 findings and recommendations, including legislative proposals, to the Governor and, in 12 accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2020, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
