2 (a) Except as provided by this section, § 1–303 of the Environment Article, and § 3 8–1815 of the Natural Resources Article, a prosecution for a misdemeanor shall be 4 instituted within 1 year after the offense was committed.

5 (GG) A PROSECUTION FOR A VIOLATION OF § 10–404(A) AND (B) OF THE 6 CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE RELATING TO THE DESTRUCTION OF FUNERARY OBJECTS 7 AND OTHER ELEMENTS OF A CEMETERY SHALL BE INSTITUTED WITHIN 5 YEARS 8 AFTER THE OFFENSE WAS COMMITTED.

11 (a) (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person 12 may not willfully destroy, damage, deface, or remove:

13 (i) an associated funerary object or another structure placed in a14 cemetery; or

15 (ii) a building, wall, fence, railing, or other work, for the use, 16 protection, or ornamentation of a cemetery.

17 (2) The provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection do not prohibit the 18 removal of a funerary object or a building, wall, fence, railing, or other object installed for 19 the use, protection, or ornamentation of a cemetery or burial site, for the purpose of repair 20 or replacement, either at the request of or with the permission of heirs or descendants of 21 the deceased or the owner or manager of the cemetery or burial site.

22 (b) (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person 23 may not willfully destroy, damage, or remove a tree, plant, or shrub in a cemetery.

(2) The provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection do not prohibit
normal maintenance of a cemetery or burial site, including trimming of trees and shrubs,
removal of weeds or noxious growths, grass cutting, or other routine care and maintenance.

(d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on convictionis subject to:

29 (1) for a violation of subsection (a) of this section, imprisonment not 30 exceeding 5 years or a fine not exceeding \$10,000 or both; and

31 (2) for a violation of subsection (b) or (c) of this section, imprisonment not 32 exceeding 2 years or a fine not exceeding \$500 or both.
