1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Department of General Services – Energy-Conserving Standards**
3 **(Maryland Sustainable Buildings Act of 2023)**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of General Services to establish and
5 periodically update standards for State buildings to conserve energy and minimize
6 adverse impacts on birds; requiring the Maryland Green Building Council to include
7 the standards in any requirements that the Council establishes for participation in
8 a higher performance building program in the State; defining “State building”; and
9 generally relating to the construction, alteration, or acquisition of State buildings.

Preamble

WHEREAS, The amount of glass used in new building construction is increasing dramatically in Maryland and worldwide; and

WHEREAS, The increase in the use of glass in buildings threatens to undo energy conservation efforts, cost the State money, and contribute to climate change and biodiversity loss; and

WHEREAS, Adopting building standards to protect birds will reduce energy consumption, making State buildings more sustainable and saving taxpayers money; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – State Finance and Procurement

4–101.

(a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) “Department” means the Department of General Services.

(c) “Secretary” means the Secretary of General Services.

4–410.1.

(A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(2) “ACQUIRED” DOES NOT INCLUDE A BUILDING LEASED BY THE STATE.

(3) “STATE BUILDING” MEANS:

~~(1)~~ (I) A BUILDING ACQUIRED THROUGH ANY MEANS BY THE STATE FOR USE BY A STATE AGENCY OR DEPARTMENT;

~~(2)~~ (II) A BUILDING CONSTRUCTED OR RENOVATED BY OR FOR THE STATE FOR OCCUPANCY BY A STATE AGENCY OR DEPARTMENT; OR

~~(3)~~ (III) A BUILDING ACQUIRED, CONSTRUCTED, OR RENOVATED FOR WHICH MORE THAN 50% OF THE MONEY FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, OR RENOVATION CAME FROM STATE FUNDS.

1 (B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

2 (1) A PUBLIC WORK CONTRACT OF LESS THAN \$500,000;

3 (2) A PUBLIC WORK CONTRACT FOR WHICH 50% OR LESS OF THE
4 FUNDS USED FOR THE PROJECT ARE STATE FUNDS; OR

5 (3) A PROJECT FOR WHICH FUNDING IS PROVIDED IN THE CAPITAL
6 BUDGET AS A GRANT TO A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION.

7 (C) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION,
8 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR STATE BUILDINGS TO
9 CONSERVE ENERGY AND MINIMIZE ADVERSE IMPACTS ON BIRDS THAT ARE
10 CONSISTENT WITH THE U.S. GREEN BUILDING COUNCIL COUNCIL'S LEED
11 INNOVATION CREDIT 55 FOR REDUCING BIRD COLLISIONS AND THE AMERICAN
12 BIRD CONSERVANCY BIRD-FRIENDLY DESIGN RECOMMENDATIONS.

13 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL UPDATE THE STANDARDS DEVELOPED
14 UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION EVERY 5 YEARS.

15 (3) THE STANDARDS DEVELOPED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL
16 SPECIFY THAT, EXCEPT WHERE FULL OPERATION OF BUILDING LIGHTING IS
17 DOCUMENTED AS NECESSARY, INCLUDING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY OR OTHER
18 PURPOSES, INTERIOR AND EXTERIOR LIGHTING SHALL BE APPROPRIATELY
19 SHIELDED AND MINIMIZED FROM MIDNIGHT TO DAWN EACH DAY:

20 (I) FROM MARCH 1 THROUGH MAY 31, BOTH INCLUSIVE; AND

21 (II) FROM AUGUST 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, BOTH INCLUSIVE.

22 (4) THE STANDARDS ESTABLISHED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
23 SUBSECTION MAY NOT INCLUDE A REQUIREMENT FOR BIRD COLLISION
24 MONITORING.

25 (5) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONSIDER THE PHYSICAL HEALTH AND
26 MENTAL HEALTH OF BUILDING OCCUPANTS WHEN DEVELOPING OR UPDATING
27 STANDARDS UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

28 (D) EACH STATE BUILDING CONSTRUCTED, SUBSTANTIALLY ALTERED, OR
29 ACQUIRED BY THE STATE SHALL MEET, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE AND WITHIN
30 BUDGETARY CONSTRAINTS AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT, THE STANDARDS
31 ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.

1 (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REDUCE THE LIGHTING OF EXISTING STATE
2 BUILDINGS, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE AND WITHIN BUDGETARY CONSTRAINTS
3 AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT:

4 (1) IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (C)(3) OF THIS SECTION; AND

5 (2) BY USING AUTOMATIC CONTROL TECHNOLOGIES, WHICH MAY
6 INCLUDE TIMERS, PHOTSENSORS, INFRARED DETECTORS, AND MOTION
7 DETECTORS.

8 (F) THE MARYLAND GREEN BUILDING COUNCIL SHALL INCLUDE THE
9 STANDARDS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION IN ANY REQUIREMENTS THAT THE
10 COUNCIL ESTABLISHES FOR PARTICIPATION IN A HIGHER PERFORMANCE BUILDING
11 PROGRAM IN THE STATE.

12 (G) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE
13 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2023.
