- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring that each health practitioner, police officer, educator, and human service worker in this State receive periodic training on the obligation to 4 report child abuse and neglect and on the identification of abused and neglected 5 children; the Maryland Department of Health to provide certain boards with a list of 6 7 certain recommended courses; requiring certain boards to post a certain list 8 prominently on the board's website, provide information about certain recommended 9 courses to certain health care professionals at a certain time, and advertise the availability of certain recommended courses in certain media; defining certain terms; 10 and generally relating to child abuse and neglect. 11
