## Courts and Judicial Proceedings - Consumer Contracts

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a merchant in a certain consumer contract from extending the period of time during which the merchant may file a civil action at law against a 4 5 consumer: prohibiting a merchant in a certain consumer contract from shortening 6 the period of time during which a consumer may file a civil action at law against a 7 merchant; establishing that a violation of certain provisions of this Act is an unfair or deceptive trade practice and is subject to certain enforcement and penalty 8 provisions; specifying that a certain statute of limitations applicable to certain 9 10 specialties does not apply to a certain consumer contract; providing that certain 11 provisions of a consumer contract are void and unenforceable; providing for the application of this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to consumer 12 contracts and civil actions. 13
