A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – Crimes Relating to Animals – Conviction and Sentencing**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing that each animal harmed in a violation of a prohibition
4 against animal cruelty is a separate offense; establishing that a conviction for a crime
5 relating to animals may not merge with a conviction for any other crime based on
6 the act establishing the violation and that a sentence imposed may be separate from
7 and consecutive to or concurrent with a sentence based on the act establishing a
8 violation; and generally relating to crimes relating to animals.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Criminal Law**

17 **10–627.**

18 **(A) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE, EACH ANIMAL HARMED IN A**
19 **VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE IS A SEPARATE OFFENSE.**

20 **(B) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, A CONVICTION UNDER THIS**
21 **SUBTITLE MAY NOT MERGE WITH A CONVICTION FOR ANY OTHER CRIME BASED ON**
22 **THE ACT ESTABLISHING THE VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

1 **(C) A SENTENCE IMPOSED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE MAY BE SEPARATE FROM**
2 **AND CONSECUTIVE TO OR CONCURRENT WITH A SENTENCE FOR ANY CRIME BASED**
3 **ON THE ACT ESTABLISHING THE VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
5 October 1, 2024.
