Task Force on the Creation of a Juvenile Assessment Center and Constructive Alternatives to Managing Youth at Risk of Delinquency in Prince George's County

FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on the Creation of a Juvenile Assessment Center and Constructive Alternatives to Managing Youth at Risk of Delinquency in Prince George's County; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to identify, study, and report on certain issues, hold certain meetings, and make certain recommendations; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Prince George's County Delegation to the House of Delegates on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force on the Creation of a Juvenile Assessment Center and Constructive Alternatives to Managing Youth at Risk of Delinquency in Prince George's County.

18 Preamble

WHEREAS, Juvenile assessment centers, comprising community—operated facilities and programs, provide central intake and screening services for youth referred to the Department of Juvenile Services; and

WHEREAS, Juvenile assessment centers are used to the fullest extent possible to conduct predisposition assessments and youth evaluations, including needs assessments, substance abuse evaluations, physical and mental health evaluations, psychological evaluations, behavioral assessments, educational assessments, aptitude testing, and vocational testing; and

WHEREAS, Individuals serving juvenile assessment centers include representatives from substance abuse programs, mental health providers, law enforcement agencies, schools, health service providers, State's Attorneys, public defenders, truancy program personnel, gang liaison law personnel, and other agencies serving youth; and

WHEREAS, The key components of a juvenile assessment center include: (1) a single point of entry, including 24-hour per day centralized intake to improve quality and efficiency; (2) immediate comprehensive needs assessment; (3) integrated case management to ensure appropriate placement; and (4) comprehensive and integrated management information systems to coordinate and monitor services and treatment progression; now, therefore,

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 12 That:
- 13 (a) There is a Task Force on the Creation of a Juvenile Assessment Center and 14 Constructive Alternatives to Managing Youth at Risk of Delinquency in Prince George's 15 County.
- 16 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland representing Prince George's County, appointed by the Chair of the Prince George's County Delegation to the Senate;
- 19 (2) two members of the House of Delegates representing Prince George's County, appointed by the Chair of the Prince George's County Delegation to the House of Delegates;
- 22 (3) the Prince George's County Chief of Police, or the Chief's designee;
- 23 (4) the Prince George's County Sheriff, or the Sheriff's designee;
- 24 (5) the juvenile court judge of the Prince George's County Circuit Court, 25 Juvenile Division, appointed by the Circuit Administrative Judge of the Seventh Circuit;
- 26 (6) a member of the Prince George's County Council, appointed by the 27 Chair of the Prince George's County Council;
- 28 (7) the Prince George's County Public Safety Director, or the Director's 29 designee;
- 30 (8) two representatives from the office of the Prince George's County 31 Executive, appointed by the Prince George's County Executive; and
- 32 (9) the Director of the Prince George's County Department of Social Services, or the Director's designee.

1 The Prince George's County Executive shall designate the chair of the Task (c) 2 Force. 3 (d) The Prince George's County Executive shall provide staff for the Task Force. 4 A member of the Task Force: (e) 5 may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but (1)6 (2)is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 7 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 8 The Task Force shall: (f) 9 (1)identify, study, and report on the current intake process for juveniles 10 who come into contact with the Prince George's County juvenile justice system; 11 (2)review successful juvenile assessment center models from other 12 counties and states and gather research relating to juvenile assessment centers; 13 (3)receive input or testimony from: 14 (i) the Department of Juvenile Services; the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention; 15 (ii) 16 Advocates for Children and Youth: (iii) 17 the Prince George's County C-PAC; (iv) 18 (v) the Prince George's County School Board and Superintendent; 19 (vi) the Prince George's County-NAACP; The Sentencing Project; and 20 (vii) 21(viii) Prince George's County municipal leaders; 22 make recommendations relating to the benefits, risks, and costs **(4)** 23 associated with the creation of a juvenile assessment center and other alternatives to 24managing youth at risk of delinquency in Prince George's County, including ways to address the following goals: 2526(i) providing a comprehensive assessment of the needs of juveniles; 27(ii) improving case management and treatment;

abrogated and of no further force and effect.
