## Procurement - State Funds - Energy Efficient Outdoor Lighting Fixtures

- 3 FOR the purpose of expanding the prohibition on the use of State funds to install or 4 replace certain luminaires by applying the prohibition to all permanent outdoor 5 luminaires unless the luminaires meet certain requirements; establishing certain requirements for luminaires intended for certain lighting purposes; 6 7 establishing certain circumstances that require the use of certain fully shielded 8 luminaires; providing that certain requirements do not apply to certain public 9 work contracts; adding to certain requirements that the Board is authorized to 10 waive; requiring the Board of Public Works to adopt certain regulations to establish a certain process and schedule for certain waiver requests; defining 11 12 certain terms; repealing a certain definition; and generally relating to the use of 13 State funds and energy efficient outdoor lighting fixtures.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 10 (5) "GLARE" MEANS LIGHT EMITTED BY A LUMINAIRE THAT 11 CAUSES DISCOMFORT OR REDUCED VISIBILITY.
- 12 **(6)** "ILLUMINANCE" MEANS THE LUMINOUS POWER INCIDENT 13 PER UNIT AREA OF A SURFACE.
- 14 **[**(2)**] (7)** "Lamp" means the component of a luminaire that produces 15 the light.
- 16 (8) "LIGHT TRESPASS" MEANS LIGHT THAT FALLS BEYOND THE 17 PROPERTY IT IS INTENDED TO ILLUMINATE.
- 18 [(3)] (9) "Lumen" means a unit of measurement of luminous flux.
- [(4)] (10) "Luminaire" means the complete lighting unit, including the lamp or other component that produces light and the assembly that holds the lamp, including an assembly housing, a mounting bracket or pole socket, a lamp holder, a ballast, a reflector or mirror, and a refractor or lens.
- 23 (11) "PARKING LOT LIGHTING" MEANS PERMANENT OUTDOOR
  24 LUMINAIRES SPECIFICALLY INTENDED TO ILLUMINATE UNCOVERED VEHICLE
  25 PARKING AREAS.
- 26 (12) "PERMANENT OUTDOOR LUMINAIRE" MEANS A LUMINAIRE
  27 FOR USE IN AN EXTERIOR ENVIRONMENT THAT IS INSTALLED WITH A MOUNTING

- [(5) "Restricted uplight luminaire" means a luminaire that:
- 30 (i) except for a 0.5% maximum incidental uplight from 31 reflection off mounting hardware, allows no direct light emission above a horizontal 32 plane through the luminaire's lowest light-emitting part; and

8 9	(IV) ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS.
10 11 12	(3) In reviewing a waiver request, the Board of Public Works or the Board's designee shall consider design safety, costs, and any other factors the Board or the Board's designee determines are appropriate.
13 14 15	(4) THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO ESTABLISH A PROCESS FOR SUBMITTING A WAIVER REQUEST AND A SCHEDULE FOR THE TIMELY RESPONSE TO A WAIVER REQUEST.
16 17	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, $2014$ .
