11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Correctional Services**

15 (a) The provisions of this section and §§ 9–508 through 9–514 of this subtitle do
16 not apply to:

17 (1) the Baltimore City Detention Center;
