BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 13 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Public Utilities 15 7-207. 16 17 (b) Except as provided in paragraph (4) of this subsection, unless a 18 certificate of public convenience and necessity for the construction is first obtained from the 19 Commission, a person may not begin construction of an overhead transmission line that is 20 designed to carry a voltage in excess of 69,000 volts or exercise a right of condemnation 21 with the construction. 22 For construction related to an existing overhead transmission (ii) 23line, the Commission may waive the requirement in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for 24good cause.

6 7 8	2. is or, on the start of commercial operation of the overhead transmission line, will be subject to regulation as a public utility by an officer or an agency of the United States.
9 10 11 12	(iv) The Commission may not issue a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the construction of an overhead transmission line in the electric distribution service territory of an electric company to an applicant other than an electric company if:
13 14	1. the overhead transmission line is to be located solely within the electric distribution service territory of that electric company; and
15 16	2. the cost of the overhead transmission line is to be paid solely by that electric company and its ratepayers.
17 18 19	(v) 1. This subparagraph applies to the construction of an overhead transmission line for which a certificate of public convenience and necessity is required under this section.

On issuance of a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the construction of an overhead transmission line, a person may acquire by condemnation, in accordance with Title 12 of the Real Property Article AND SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE COMMISSION, any property or right necessary for the construction or maintenance of the transmission line.
