# Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class B Cafe Licenses

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Harford County Liquor Control Board to issue a special Class B Cafe beer, wine and liquor license; specifying an annual Class B Cafe beer, 4  $\mathbf{5}$ wine and liquor license fee; specifying that the Class B Cafe beer, wine and liquor 6 license entitles the holder to sell beer and wine for consumption on and off the 7 premises and liquor for consumption on the premises; specifying that the Class B 8 Cafe beer, wine and liquor license is a 7-day license with an on-premises wine 9 tasting privilege for a certain number of days; requiring the Board to set the 10 maximum amount of Class B Cafe beer, wine and liquor licenses that it may issue; 11 requiring the Board to set a maximum and a minimum seating capacity for each 12Class B Cafe beer, wine and liquor license it issues; authorizing the Class B Cafe 13beer, wine and liquor license to be issued only if certain conditions are met; 14 authorizing the Class B Cafe beer, wine and liquor license to be used for off-premises 15catering; repealing the prohibition against the Board issuing more than a certain number of Class B Cafe beer and light wine licenses and requiring the Board to set 1617the maximum amount of Class B Cafe beer and light wine licenses that it may issue; 18 repealing the prohibition against and authorizing the use of a Class B Cafe beer and 19light wine license for off-premises catering; and generally relating to Class B Cafe 20licenses in Harford County.

16	(a) (1) A Class B beer and light wine license shall be issued by the license
17	issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. The holder may
18 10	keep for sale and sell beer and light wines at retail at any hotel or restaurant, at the place
19	described in the license, for consumption on the premises or elsewhere.
20	(n) (1) This subsection applies only in Harford County.
21	(6) (i) There is a Class B Cafe beer and wine license.
22	(ii) The annual license fee is \$1,575.

27 28 29	(v) The Liquor Control Board [may issue not more than five cafe licenses] SHALL SET THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF CAFE LICENSES THAT IT MAY ISSUE UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH.
30 31	(vi) The Liquor Control Board shall set a maximum and a minimum seating capacity for each cafe license it issues.
32	(vii) A cafe license may be exercised at an establishment only if:

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1 1. The Liquor Control Board determines that the 2 establishment has adequate tables, chairs, food, and facilities for preparing and serving 3 meals;

2. The average gross monthly receipts from the sale of cooked or prepared food served at the establishment and other items approved by the Liquor Control Board exceed 50% of the average monthly receipts from the sale of beer and wine sold for on-premises consumption; and

8 3. Not more than 10% of the total square footage of the 9 establishment is dedicated to the public display of beer and wine that is offered for sale.

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(viii) A cafe license may [not] be used for off–premises catering.

12 (a) (1) A Class B beer, wine and liquor license shall be issued by the license 13 issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located, and the license 14 authorizes its holder to keep for sale and sell all alcoholic beverages at retail at any hotel 15 or restaurant at the place described, for consumption on the premises or elsewhere, or as 16 provided in this section.

17 (n) (1) This subsection applies only in Harford County.

18 (10) (I) THE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD MAY ISSUE A SPECIAL 19 CLASS B CAFE BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE.

20**(II)** THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$3,000. 21(III) A CAFE LICENSE ENTITLES THE HOLDER TO SELL: 221. BEER AND WINE FOR CONSUMPTION ON OR OFF THE 23LICENSED PREMISES; AND 242. LIQUOR FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE LICENSED 25PREMISES ONLY. 26(IV) A CAFE LICENSE IS A 7-DAY LICENSE WITH AN

ON-PREMISES WINE TASTING PRIVILEGE FOR EVERY DAY OF THE YEAR.
(V) THE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD SHALL SET THE MAXIMUM

29 NUMBER OF CAFE LICENSES THAT IT MAY ISSUE UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH.

30(VI)THE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD SHALL SET A MAXIMUM AND31A MINIMUM SEATING CAPACITY FOR EACH CAFE LICENSE IT ISSUES.

**ONLY IF:** 1. **PREPARING AND SERVING MEALS:** 2. **ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION; AND** NOT MORE THAN 10% OF THE TOTAL SQUARE 3. FOOTAGE OF THE ESTABLISHMENT IS DEDICATED TO THE PUBLIC DISPLAY OF BEER AND WINE THAT IS OFFERED FOR SALE. CATERING. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
