CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Family Law – Protective Orders – Additional Relief

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a judge in a final protective order to order the 4 respondent to remain a specified distance away from the residence, place of $\mathbf{5}$ employment, school, or temporary residence of a person eligible for relief; and 6 generally relating to protective orders.

12SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13

- 16 (d) The final protective order may include any or all of the following relief:

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1 (1) order the respondent to refrain from abusing or threatening to 2 abuse any person eligible for relief;

3 (2) order the respondent to refrain from contacting, attempting to 4 contact, or harassing any person eligible for relief;

5 (3) order the respondent to refrain from entering the residence of any 6 person eligible for relief;

7where the person eligible for relief and the respondent are residing (4)8 together at the time of the abuse, order the respondent to vacate the home 9 immediately and award temporary use and possession of the home to the person eligible for relief or, in the case of alleged abuse of a child or alleged abuse of a 10 vulnerable adult, award temporary use and possession of the home to an adult living 11 12in the home, provided that the court may not grant an order to vacate and award temporary use and possession of the home to a nonspouse person eligible for relief 13 unless the name of the person eligible for relief appears on the lease or deed to the 14home or the person eligible for relief has shared the home with the respondent for a 1516 period of at least 90 days within 1 year before the filing of the petition;

17 (5) order the respondent to remain away from the place of 18 employment, school, or temporary residence of a person eligible for relief or home of 19 other family members;

20 (6) order the respondent to remain away from a child care provider of 21 a person eligible for relief while a child of the person is in the care of the child care 22 provider;

23 (7) ORDER THE RESPONDENT TO REMAIN A SPECIFIED DISTANCE
24 AWAY FROM THE RESIDENCE, PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT, SCHOOL, OR
25 TEMPORARY RESIDENCE OF A PERSON ELIGIBLE FOR RELIEF;

26 [(7)] (8) award temporary custody of a minor child of the respondent 27 and a person eligible for relief;

[(8)] (9) establish temporary visitation with a minor child of the respondent and a person eligible for relief on a basis which gives primary consideration to the welfare of the minor child and the safety of any other person eligible for relief. If the court finds that the safety of a person eligible for relief will be jeopardized by unsupervised or unrestricted visitation, the court shall condition or restrict visitation as to time, place, duration, or supervision, or deny visitation entirely, as needed to guard the safety of any person eligible for relief;

35 [(9)] (10) award emergency family maintenance as necessary to 36 support any person eligible for relief to whom the respondent has a duty of support 37 under this article, including an immediate and continuing withholding order on all

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1 earnings of the respondent in the amount of the ordered emergency family
2 maintenance in accordance with the procedures specified in Title 10, Subtitle 1, Part
3 III of this article;

4 [(10)] (11) award temporary use and possession of a vehicle jointly 5 owned by the respondent and a person eligible for relief to the person eligible for relief 6 if necessary for the employment of the person eligible for relief or for the care of a 7 minor child of the respondent or a person eligible for relief;

8 [(11)] (12) direct the respondent or any or all of the persons eligible for 9 relief to participate in professionally supervised counseling or a domestic violence 10 program;

11 [(12)] (13) order the respondent to pay filing fees and costs of a 12 proceeding under this subtitle; or

13 [(13)] (14) award temporary possession of any pet of the person eligible
 14 for relief or the respondent.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect16 June 1, 2012.
