## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Environment – Portable Floating Docks – Exemptions**

3 FOR the purpose of exempting the installation or repair of certain portable floating  
4 docks from a requirement to pay certain fees under the Wetlands and  
5 Waterways Program; exempting the installation or repair of certain portable  
6 floating docks from certain marine contractor licensure requirements by  
7 altering a certain definition; and generally relating to portable floating docks.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Environment**

21 5–203.1.

22 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

23 (2) “Major project” means a project that:

1 (i) Proposes to permanently impact 5,000 square feet or more of  
2 wetlands or waterways, including the 100-year floodplain;

3 (ii) Is located in an area identified as potentially impacting  
4 threatened or endangered species or species in need of conservation by a geographical  
5 information system database that:

6 1. Includes sensitive species project review areas and  
7 waterfowl concentration and staging areas;

8 2. Has been developed and maintained by the  
9 Department of Natural Resources; and

10 3. Is used by the Department to screen incoming  
11 applications;

12 (iii) Is located in an area that has been identified as potentially  
13 impacting historical or archeological resources by a geographical information system  
14 database that:

15 1. Includes Maryland archeological sites, the Maryland  
16 Inventory of Historic Properties, the National Register of Historic Places, the  
17 Maryland Historical Trust Preservation Easements, the Annapolis Maryland  
18 Inventory of Historic Properties, and the Annapolis Maryland Inventory of Historic  
19 Properties street map;

20 2. Has been developed and maintained by the Maryland  
21 Historical Trust; and

22 3. Is used by the Department to screen incoming  
23 applications;

24 (iv) Is located in an area identified as potentially impacting a  
25 nontidal wetland of special State concern by a geographical information system  
26 database that:

27 1. Has been developed and maintained by the  
28 Department of Natural Resources; and

29 2. Is used by the Department to screen incoming  
30 applications;

31 (v) Is adjacent to Use III or Use IV waters, as defined in  
32 regulation by the Department; or

33 (vi) Requires the issuance of a public notice by the Department.

34 (3) "Minor project" means a project that:

1 (i) Proposes to permanently impact less than 5,000 square feet  
2 of wetlands or waterways, including the 100-year floodplain; and

3 (ii) Does not meet the definition of a major project.

4 (b) (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2) of this subsection, all  
5 applications for wetlands and waterways authorizations issued by the Department  
6 under §§ 5-503, 5-906, 16-202, 16-302, and 16-307 of this article or wetlands licenses  
7 issued by the Board of Public Works under § 16-202 of this article shall be  
8 accompanied by an application fee as follows:

9 (i) For an application for a minor project or general  
10 permit.....\$750;

11 (ii) For an application for a minor modification ..... \$500;

12 (iii) For an application for a major project or major modification  
13 with a proposed permanent impact of:

14 1. Less than 1/4 acre.....\$1,500;

15 2. At least 1/4 acre, but less than 1/2  
16 acre.....\$3,000;

17 3. At least 1/2 acre, but less than 3/4  
18 acre.....\$4,500;

19 4. At least 3/4 acre, but less than 1  
20 acre.....\$6,000; and

21 5. 1 acre or more.....the impact  
22 area in acres multiplied by \$7,500.

23 (2) The following are exempt from the application fees established  
24 under paragraph (1) of this subsection:

25 (i) Regulated activities conducted by the State, a municipal  
26 corporation, county, bicounty or multicounty agency under Article 28 of the Code or  
27 Division II of the Public Utilities Article, or a unit of the State, a municipal  
28 corporation, or a county;

29 (ii) Performance of agricultural best management practices  
30 contained in a soil conservation and water quality plan approved by the appropriate  
31 soil conservation district;

32 (iii) Performance of forestry best management practices  
33 contained in an erosion and sediment control plan:

- 1                   1.     Prepared by a registered forester; and
- 2                   2.     Approved by the appropriate soil conservation district;
- 3                   (iv)   Stream restoration, vegetative shoreline stabilization,
- 4 wetland creation, or other project in which the primary effect is to enhance the State's
- 5 wetland or water resources; [and]
- 6                   (v)   Aquacultural activities for which the Department of Natural
- 7 Resources has issued a permit under § 4-11A-02 of the Natural Resources Article;
- 8 **AND**

9                   **(VI)   INSTALLATION OR REPAIR OF PORTABLE FLOATING**

10 **DOCKS.**

12           (a)    In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

13           (e)    “Licensed marine contractor” means an individual or entity that has

14 received a license from the Board to perform marine contractor services.

15           (f)    (1)   “Marine contractor services” means construction, demolition,

16 installation, alteration, repair, or salvage activities located in, on, over, or under State

17 or private tidal wetlands.

18           (2)    “Marine contractor services” includes:

19                   (i)    Dredging and filling;

20                   (ii)   The construction, demolition, installation, alteration, repair,

21 or salvage of structures, including boathouses, boat or other personal watercraft lifts

22 or ramps, slips, docks, floating platforms, moorings, piers, pier access structures,

23 pilings, wetland observation platforms, wetland walkways, and wharfs; and

24                   (iii)   The construction, demolition, installation, alteration, repair,

25 or salvage of stabilization and erosion control measures, including revetments,

26 breakwaters, bulkheads, groins, jetties, stone sills, marsh establishments, and beach

27 nourishment or other similar projects.

28                   **(3)   “MARINE CONTRACTOR SERVICES” DOES NOT INCLUDE THE**

29 **INSTALLATION OR REPAIR OF PORTABLE FLOATING DOCKS.**

30           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

31 June 1, 2011.
