A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Pharmacy Benefits Managers – Prescription Drugs – Maximum Allowable Cost Prices

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a pharmacy benefits manager to disclose to a purchaser 5 and specify in its contract with a purchaser certain information relating to 6 maximum allowable cost prices for certain prescription drugs; requiring a 7 pharmacy benefits manager to specify in its contract with a pharmacy or 8 pharmacist certain information relating to maximum allowable drug prices for 9 certain prescription drugs; requiring a pharmacy benefits manager to update the maximum allowable cost prices with a certain frequency; requiring a 10 pharmacy benefits manager to establish a process for taking certain actions 11 12 relating to maximum allowable cost prices; requiring a pharmacy benefits 13 manager to establish a procedure that allows a pharmacy or pharmacist to appeal a maximum allowable cost price; establishing certain requirements 14 relating to an appeal; providing that, under certain circumstances, a pharmacy 15 16 benefits manager must ensure that a prescription drug meets certain 17 requirements; and generally relating to maximum allowable cost prices for 18 prescription drugs in pharmacy benefits manager contracts.

- 14 (1) HAS AT LEAST THREE NATIONALLY AVAILABLE AND 15 THERAPEUTICALLY EQUIVALENT MULTIPLE SOURCES WITH A SIGNIFICANT 16 COST DIFFERENCE;
- 17 (2) IS LISTED AS THERAPEUTICALLY AND PHARMACEUTICALLY
 18 EQUIVALENT ("A" RATED) IN THE MOST RECENT VERSION OF THE U.S. FOOD
 19 AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION PUBLICATION "APPROVED DRUG PRODUCTS
 20 WITH THERAPEUTIC EQUIVALENCE EVALUATIONS" ("ORANGE BOOK");
- 21 (3) IS AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE WITHOUT LIMITATION, FROM 22 NATIONAL OR REGIONAL WHOLESALE DISTRIBUTORS, BY ALL PHARMACIES AND 23 PHARMACISTS IN THE STATE; AND
- 24 (4) IS NOT OBSOLETE OR TEMPORARILY UNAVAILABLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
