Health Occupations - <u>Advanced Practice Registered</u> Nurses - Delegation of Nursing Tasks

4 FOR the purpose of providing that an advanced practice registered nurse is not precluded from delegating a nursing task to an unlicensed individual under certain $\mathbf{5}$ 6 eircumstances; providing that a registered nurse, a licensed practical nurse, or an 7 advanced practice registered nurse is not precluded from delegating a nursing or 8 other technical task to an assistant with medical training under certain circumstances; requiring the State Board of Nursing to adopt certain regulations; 9 and generally relating to advanced practice registered nurses delegating nursing 10 tasks. 11

2 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, an individual shall be certified 3 by the Board to practice as a nursing assistant or medication technician before the 4 individual may practice as a nursing assistant or medication technician in the State.

(b) This subtitle does not apply to an individual who:

6 (1) Practices a health occupation that the individual is authorized to 7 practice under this article;

8 (2) Provides for the gratuitous care of friends, domestic partners, or family9 members;

10 (3) Performs nursing assistant tasks while a nursing student enrolled in 11 an accredited nursing program and practicing under the direct supervision of qualified 12 faculty or preceptors;

(4) Performs nursing assistant tasks as a student while:

14 (i) Enrolled in a Board–approved nursing assistant training 15 program; and

16 (ii) Practicing under the direct supervision of qualified faculty or17 preceptors;

20 (6) Works as a principal or school secretary, does not administer 21 medication as a routine part of the position, and has completed training by the delegating 22 nurse for the occasion where the individual may need to administer medication in the 23 absence of the nurse or medication technician.
