- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting consumer reporting agencies from including in a consumer
- 4 report certain records relating to a criminal proceeding involving a consumer;

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 Article Commercial Law
- 16 **14–1203.1.**
- 17 (A) A CONSUMER REPORTING AGENCY MAY NOT INCLUDE IN A CONSUMER
- 18 **REPORT:**
- 19 (1) ANY RECORD OF A CRIMINAL PROCEEDING CONCERNING THE
- 20 CONSUMER:
- 21 (I) IN WHICH THE CONSUMER WAS FALSELY ACCUSED,
- 22 ACQUITTED, OR EXONERATED;

- 1 (II) IN WHICH A NOLLE PROSEQUI WAS ENTERED AS TO A 2 CHARGE CONCERNING THE CONSUMER; OR
- 3 (III) THAT DID NOT RESULT IN A GUILTY VERDICT FOR OR 4 GUILTY PLEA BY THE CONSUMER; OR
- 5 (2) ANY CRIMINAL RECORDS CONCERNING THE CONSUMER THAT 6 HAVE BEEN EXPUNGED.
- 7 (B) A CONSUMER REPORTING AGENCY MAY NOT RELY ON THE 8 INFORMATION CONTAINED IN RECORDS LISTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS 9 SECTION TO MAKE A DETERMINATION REGARDING THE CREDITWORTHINESS OF A 10 CONSUMER.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 2023.
