HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

Safe Harbor Legislation and Regulations Needed to Form Accountable Care Organizations

FOR the purpose of urging the United State Congress and the Federal Trade
Commission to pass legislation and adopt regulations establishing certain safe
harbors that will allow physicians to collaborate in certain health insurance
marketplaces and form accountable care organizations; and generally relating
to safe harbor legislation and regulations needed for accountable care
organizations.

10 WHEREAS, Federal antitrust law, including the Clayton Antitrust Act, has 11 restricted the ability of physicians to collaborate; and

12 WHEREAS, Within the last 10 years an increase in the concentration of the 13 health insurance industry has resulted in most health insurance marketplaces being 14 dominated by one or two large carriers; and

15 WHEREAS, CareFirst presently controls between 65% to 80% of the health 16 insurance marketplace in Maryland; and

WHEREAS, The high concentration of insurer control of health insurance
marketplaces places physicians in an unfair negotiating position with the insurers
that control the marketplaces; and

20 WHEREAS, The passage of recent federal health care legislation included 21 provisions promoting the formation of accountable care organizations; and

22 WHEREAS, Accountable care organizations must be formed to provide high 23 quality health care coverage for Americans; and

WHEREAS, The ability of physicians to effectively form accountable care organizations is hindered by the interpretation and enforcement of federal antitrust law; and



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1 WHEREAS, Physicians can form accountable care organizations only if 2 antitrust safe harbors are developed; and

3 WHEREAS, The Federal Trade Commission is considering proposals to develop 4 antitrust safe harbors for physicians collaborating to form accountable care 5 organizations; now, therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the 7 General Assembly of Maryland urges the United States Congress and the Federal 8 Trade Commission to pass legislation and adopt regulations that will establish 9 antitrust safe harbors for physicians to collaborate in health insurance markets 10 dominated by one or two health insurers and form accountable care organizations; and 11 be it further
