Baltimore County – Commission to Study the Establishment of a Truancy Reduction Program

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission to Study the Establishment of a 5 Truancy Reduction Program in Baltimore County; providing for the 6 composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a member of the 7 Commission from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the 8 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission to study and 9 make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Commission to 10 report its findings and recommendations to the Baltimore County Executive, 11 the Superintendent of the Baltimore County Public Schools, the Baltimore County Board of Education, certain committees of the General Assembly, and 12 the Chair of the Baltimore County Senators and the Chair of the Baltimore 13 County Delegation of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; 14 15 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 16 Commission to Study the Establishment of a Truancy Reduction Program in 17 Baltimore County.
- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That:
- 20 (a) There is a Commission to Study the Establishment of a Truancy 21 Reduction Program in Baltimore County.
- 22 (b) The Commission consists of:
- 23 (1) the Baltimore County Executive, or the County Executive's 24 designee;



- 1 (2)the Baltimore County State's Attorney, or the State's Attorney's 2 designee; 3 (3)the Director of the Baltimore County Department of Social Services, or the Director's designee: 4 a designee of the Secretary of Juvenile Services who works in 5 6 Baltimore County; and 7 the following members, appointed by the Baltimore County 8 Executive, in consultation with the Chair of the Baltimore County Senators and the 9 Chair of the Baltimore County Delegation of the General Assembly: 10 (i) one administrative judge of the Baltimore County Circuit 11 Court; 12 (ii) one employee of the Baltimore County Public Schools who 13 works in Pupil Personnel Services; one employee of the Baltimore County Public Schools who 14 15 works as a court liaison; 16 one employee of the Baltimore County Public Schools who (iv) 17 works as a school counselor: 18 one employee of the Baltimore County Public Schools who (v) 19 works as a high school principal; 20 one employee of the Baltimore County Public Schools who (vi) works as an Assistant Superintendent or an Executive Director; and 2122one representative of the Teachers Association of Baltimore (vii) 23 County. 24 The Baltimore County Executive, in consultation with the Chair of the Baltimore County Senators and the Chair of the Baltimore County Delegation of the 2526 General Assembly, shall designate the chair of the Commission. 27 The Department of Student Support Services of the Baltimore County 28 Public Schools shall provide staff for the Commission. 29 (e) A member of the Commission: 30 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but
- 31 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard 32 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
