## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Public Safety - Task Force on Volunteer Fire Companies and Rescue Squads

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on Volunteer Fire Companies and Rescue Squads; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; 4 5 prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but 6 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to 7 study and make recommendations regarding certain matters relating to staffing and 8 recruitment for volunteer fire companies and rescue squads; requiring the Task 9 Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and 10 generally relating to the Task Force on Volunteer Fire Companies and Rescue 11 12 Squads.
- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 14 That:
- 15 (a) There is a Task Force on Volunteer Fire Companies and Rescue Squads.
- 16 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of 18 the Senate;
- 19 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 20 the House;
- 21 (3) two members of the Executive Branch, appointed by the Governor;
- 22 (4) the State Fire Marshal, or the State Fire Marshal's designee;
- 23 (5) one representative of the Maryland Emergency Management Agency,

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June

1, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2020, this

Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no

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further force and effect.
