Capital Projects – Inclusion of Public Art
FOR the purpose of expanding a certain requirement that public art be used in certain capital projects; and generally relating to the inclusion of public art in capital projects.
BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Finance and Procurement Section 3–602.2 Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Barlacement Volume and 2018 Symplement)
(2015 Replacement Volume and 2018 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
