- 1 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR 2 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 5 YEARS OR A 3 FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR BOTH.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
