9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 10 MARYLAND, That:

11 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
 12 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
 13 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2014 in the total principal amount of
 14 ~~\$1,166,065,000~~ ~~\$1,170,615,377~~ \$1,180,515,377. This loan shall be evidenced by the
 15 issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a
 16 resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance
 17 with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 and 8-131.2 of the State Finance and Procurement
 18 Article.

19 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold
 20 as a single issue of bonds under § 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

21 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
 22 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
 23 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then
 24 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
