- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring that regulations adopted under certain provisions of law 4 regulating behavioral health programs include provisions authorizing a medical 5 director of a behavioral health program located in a federally designated health 6 professional shortage area to provide services through telehealth, and prohibiting a 7 behavioral health program located in a federally designated health professional 8 shortage area from requiring a medical director to provide services onsite satisfy any 9 regulatory requirement that the medical director be on-site through the medical 10 director's use of telehealth; and generally relating to medical directors of behavioral health programs providing services through telehealth. 11
