A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Environment – Packaging Materials – Producer Responsibility**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain producers of packaging materials to individually or
4 as part of a producer responsibility organization submit a certain packaging
5 materials producer responsibility plan to the Department of the Environment for
6 review and approval on or before a certain date and in accordance with certain
7 requirements; prohibiting, on or after a certain date, a producer of certain packaging
8 materials from selling, offering for sale, distributing, or importing certain packaging
9 materials unless the producer, individually or as part of a producer responsibility
10 organization, has an approved producer responsibility plan on file with the
11 Department; requiring a producer responsibility organization to implement a
12 producer responsibility plan within a certain amount of time after the Department
13 approves the producer responsibility plan; establishing a producer responsibility
14 plan advisory council; authorizing a local government to request reimbursement
15 from a certain producer that has an approved producer responsibility plan on file
16 with the Department for certain costs in a certain manner; requiring the Office of
17 Recycling in the Department to conduct certain statewide recycling needs
18 assessments in a certain manner and to submit certain reports on the results of the
19 assessments to the Governor and General Assembly on or before certain dates; and
20 generally relating to producer responsibility for packaging materials.

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
4 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 **Article – Environment**

6 9–1702.

7 (a) There is an Office of Recycling created within the Department.

8 (b) The Secretary shall appoint a Director and sufficient staff to perform the
9 functions of the Office. After July 1, 1989, the number of staff shall be as provided in the
10 budget.

11 (c) The Secretary may adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this
12 subtitle.

13 (d) The Office shall:

14 (1) Assist the counties in developing an acceptable recycling plan required
15 under § 9–1703 of this subtitle and § 9–505 of this title, including technical assistance to
16 the local governments;

17 (2) Coordinate the efforts of the State to facilitate the implementation of
18 the recycling goals at the county level;

19 (3) Review all recycling plans submitted as part of a county plan as
20 required under § 9–505 of this title and advise the Secretary on the adequacy of the
21 recycling plan;

22 (4) Administer the Statewide Electronics Recycling Program under Part IV
23 of this subtitle; [and]

24 (5) Promote the development of markets for recycled materials and
25 recycled products in the State in accordance with § 9–1702.1 of this subtitle;

26 **(6) CONDUCT A STATEWIDE RECYCLING NEEDS ASSESSMENT EVERY**
27 **10 YEARS IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 9–1702.2 OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND**

28 **(7) REVIEW AND APPROVE, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE PRODUCER**
29 **RESPONSIBILITY PLAN ADVISORY COUNCIL ESTABLISHED UNDER § 9–2405 OF THIS**
30 **TITLE, PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLANS AND ANNUAL REPORTS SUBMITTED IN**
31 **ACCORDANCE WITH SUBTITLE 24 OF THIS TITLE.**

1 (e) Beginning on January 1, 1990, and biannually thereafter, the Office shall, in
2 coordination with the Maryland Environmental Service, study and report to the Governor
3 and, subject to § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on:

4 (1) The identification and location of recycling centers, including an
5 analysis of existing recycling centers and the need to expand these facilities or construct
6 new recycling centers;

7 (2) Programs necessary to educate the public on the need to participate in
8 recycling efforts;

9 (3) The economics and financing of existing and proposed systems of waste
10 disposal and recycling;

11 (4) State procurement policies for the purchase of recycled materials;

12 (5) Programs necessary to reduce the amount of solid waste generated for
13 disposal by a State agency or unit;

14 (6) The liaison role with local governments, the federal government, and
15 the private sector;

16 (7) The percentage reduction in the amount of solid waste that has been
17 achieved by each county; and

18 (8) Economically feasible methods for the recycling of scrap automobile
19 tires, batteries, and white goods.

20 (f) (1) By December 1, 1988, the Office shall, in coordination with the
21 Maryland Environmental Service and the Governor's Task Force on Solid Waste, make
22 recommendations to the General Assembly for the financing of a comprehensive system of
23 recycling at the State and local level, including funding for recycling centers, recycling
24 equipment, recycling education, and marketing strategies.

25 (2) After the financing recommendations are made under paragraph (1) of
26 this subsection, each county may submit to the Office and the Governor a detailed request
27 for funds necessary to assist in the development and implementation of a recycling plan
28 under guidelines developed by the Office.

29 (g) In studying feasible methods for the management and recycling of used tires
30 under subsection (e)(9) of this section, the Office of Recycling shall consult with the
31 appropriate industry, including representatives of:

32 (1) Tire manufacturers;

33 (2) Tire dealers; and

1 (3) Tire recyclers.

15 (III) PROCESSING RECYCLABLE OR COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS
16 IN THE STATE;

17 (IV) TAKING ADVANTAGE OF FAVORABLE MARKET CONDITIONS
18 OR OTHER OPPORTUNITIES FOR INCREASING RECYCLING OR COMPOSTING IN THE
19 STATE;

20 (V) CONSUMER EDUCATION REGARDING RECYCLING,
21 COMPOSTING, AND CONTAMINATION REDUCTION;

22 (VI) REUSE INFRASTRUCTURE; AND

23 (VII) COMPOSTING INFRASTRUCTURE;

24 (2) AN EVALUATION OF COMMINGLED RECYCLING PROCESSING
25 FACILITY WORKER CONDITIONS, WAGES, AND BENEFITS;

26 (3) THE AVAILABILITY OF OPPORTUNITIES IN THE RECYCLING
27 SYSTEM FOR WOMEN AND MINORITY INDIVIDUALS;

28 (4) THE SUFFICIENCY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT REQUIREMENTS
29 RELATED TO MULTIFAMILY RECYCLING SERVICES AND THEIR IMPLEMENTATION;

1 **(5) THE SUFFICIENCY OF RECYCLING EDUCATION PROGRAMS**
2 **RELATIVE TO DESIRED EQUITY OUTCOMES;**

3 **(6) THE AVAILABILITY OF OPPORTUNITIES IN THE RECYCLING**
4 **SYSTEM FOR BUSINESSES IN THE STATE; AND**

5 **(7) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING EQUITY AND EQUITABLE**
6 **OUTCOMES FOR UNDERSERVED POPULATIONS IN THE STATE'S RECYCLING SYSTEM,**
7 **INCLUDING RECOMMENDATIONS FOR NEW RESPONSIBILITIES OF PRODUCER**
8 **RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUNDING THE NEW**
9 **RESPONSIBILITIES.**

10 **(C) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2023, AND EACH OCTOBER 1 EVERY 10**
11 **YEARS THEREAFTER, THE OFFICE SHALL REPORT ON THE RESULTS OF THE MOST**
12 **RECENT ASSESSMENT CONDUCTED UNDER THIS SECTION TO THE GOVERNOR AND,**
13 **IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE**
14 **GENERAL ASSEMBLY.**

15 **(D) IN CONDUCTING THE ASSESSMENT REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION,**
16 **THE OFFICE SHALL CONSULT WITH PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATIONS,**
17 **THE PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN ADVISORY COUNCIL ESTABLISHED UNDER §**
18 **9-2405 OF THIS TITLE, APPROPRIATE LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES, AND**
19 **REGIONAL SOLID WASTE ORGANIZATIONS IN THE STATE.**

20 **(E) THE OFFICE SHALL ESTABLISH AND COLLECT A FEE TO BE PAID BY**
21 **PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATIONS TO COVER THE COSTS ASSOCIATED**
22 **WITH CONDUCTING THE ASSESSMENTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION.**

24 (f) (1) There is a State Recycling Trust Fund.

25 (2) The Fund shall consist of:

26 (i) The newsprint recycling incentive fee;

27 (ii) The telephone directory recycling incentive fee collected under §
28 9-1709 of this subtitle;

29 (iii) The covered electronic device manufacturer registration fee
30 collected under § 9-1728 of this subtitle;

31 **(IV) ANY FEES COLLECTED FROM PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY**
32 **ORGANIZATIONS UNDER § 9-1702.2 OF THIS SUBTITLE OR SUBTITLE 24 OF THIS**

1 **TITLE;**

2 [(iv)] (v) All fines and penalties collected under this subtitle;

3 [(v)] (VI) Money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund; and

4 [(vi)] (VII) Any other money from any other source accepted for the
5 benefit of the Fund.

6 (3) The Secretary shall administer the Fund.

7 (4) The Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately and the Comptroller shall
8 account for the Fund.

9 (5) At the end of each fiscal year, any unspent or unencumbered balance in
10 the Fund that exceeds \$2,000,000 shall revert to the General Fund of the State in
11 accordance with § 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

12 (6) In accordance with the State budget, the Fund shall be used only:

13 (i) To provide grants to the counties to be used by the counties to
14 develop and implement local recycling plans;

15 (ii) To provide grants to counties that have addressed methods for
16 the separate collection and recycling of covered electronic devices in accordance with §
17 9–1703(c)(1) of this subtitle;

18 (iii) To provide grants to municipalities to be used by the
19 municipalities to implement local covered electronic device recycling programs; [and]

20 **(IV) TO COVER THE COSTS OF THE STATEWIDE RECYCLING**
21 **NEEDS ASSESSMENT CONDUCTED UNDER § 9–1702.2 OF THIS SUBTITLE;**

22 **(V) TO COVER THE COSTS OF PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN**
23 **REVIEW, OVERSIGHT, AND ENFORCEMENT UNDER SUBTITLE 24 OF THIS TITLE; AND**

24 [(iv)] (VI) To carry out the purposes of the land management
25 administration.

26 (7) (i) The Treasurer shall invest the money in the Fund in the same
27 manner as other State money may be invested.

28 (ii) Any investment earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the
29 General Fund of the State.

4 (B) "ADVISORY COUNCIL" MEANS THE PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN
5 ADVISORY COUNCIL ESTABLISHED UNDER § 9-2405 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

6 (C) "BEVERAGE CONTAINER" MEANS A PREPACKAGED BEVERAGE
7 CONTAINER:

8 (1) MADE OF ANY MATERIAL, INCLUDING GLASS, PLASTIC, METAL,
9 CARTON, POUCH, OR ASEPTIC PACKAGING, SUCH AS A DRINK BOX, OR OF
10 MULTIMATERIALS; AND

11 (2) THE VOLUME OF WHICH IS NOT MORE THAN 5 LITERS.

12 (D) (1) "PACKAGING MATERIALS" MEANS, REGARDLESS OF
13 RECYCLABILITY, ANY PART OF A PACKAGE OR CONTAINER, INCLUDING MATERIAL
14 THAT IS USED FOR THE CONTAINMENT, PROTECTION, HANDLING, DELIVERY, AND
15 PRESENTATION OF A PRODUCT THAT IS SOLD, OFFERED FOR SALE, IMPORTED, OR
16 DISTRIBUTED IN THE STATE.

17 (2) "PACKAGING MATERIALS" INCLUDES:

18 (I) PRIMARY, SECONDARY, AND TERTIARY PACKAGING
19 INTENDED FOR THE CONSUMER MARKET;

20 (II) SERVICE PACKAGING DESIGNED AND INTENDED TO BE
21 FILLED AT THE POINT OF SALE, INCLUDING:

22 1. CARRY-OUT BAGS;

23 2. BULK GOODS BAGS;

24 3. TAKE-OUT AND HOME DELIVERY FOOD SERVICE
25 PACKAGING; AND

26 4. PRESCRIPTION AND PHARMACEUTICAL PACKAGING;
27 AND

28 (III) BEVERAGE CONTAINERS.

1 **(E) (1) “PRODUCER” MEANS A PERSON THAT MEETS ONE OF THE**
2 **FOLLOWING CLASSIFICATIONS, IN DESCENDING ORDER OF RESPONSIBILITY:**

3 **(I) A PERSON THAT USES PACKAGING MATERIALS FOR THE**
4 **SALE OR DISTRIBUTION OF A PRODUCT UNDER THE PERSON’S OWN NAME OR BRAND;**

5 **(II) A PERSON THAT IS A LICENSEE OF A TRADEMARK UNDER**
6 **WHICH A PACKAGING MATERIAL IS SOLD, OFFERED FOR SALE, DISTRIBUTED, OR**
7 **OTHERWISE USED IN A COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISE IN THE STATE, REGARDLESS OF**
8 **WHETHER THE TRADEMARK IS REGISTERED; OR**

9 **(III) A PERSON THAT IMPORTS A PRODUCT THAT INCLUDES A**
10 **PACKAGING MATERIAL AND THAT IS SOLD, OFFERED FOR SALE, DISTRIBUTED, OR**
11 **OTHERWISE USED IN A COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISE IN THE STATE.**

12 **(2) “PRODUCER” DOES NOT INCLUDE:**

13 **(I) A LOCAL GOVERNMENT; OR**

14 **(II) A NONPROFIT CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION.**

15 **(F) (1) “PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATION” MEANS:**

16 **(I) A PRODUCER THAT INDIVIDUALLY SUBMITS A PRODUCER**
17 **RESPONSIBILITY PLAN TO THE DEPARTMENT UNDER § 9-2404 OF THIS SUBTITLE;**
18 **OR**

19 **(II) A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT IS:**

20 **1. EXEMPT FROM TAXATION UNDER § 501(C)(3) OF THE**
21 **INTERNAL REVENUE CODE; AND**

22 **2. CREATED BY A GROUP OF PRODUCERS TO**
23 **IMPLEMENT A PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN.**

24 **(2) “PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATION” INCLUDES A**
25 **REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION CREATED BY A GROUP OF PRODUCER**
26 **RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 9-2404(A)(1)(II)2 OF**
27 **THIS SUBTITLE.**

28 **(G) “PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN” MEANS A PACKAGING MATERIALS**
29 **PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN SUBMITTED TO THE DEPARTMENT BY A**

1 PRODUCER OR PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH
2 § 9-2404 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

3 9-2402.

4 IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT THIS SUBTITLE PROVIDE
5 A FRAMEWORK FOR:

6 (1) MODERNIZING AND IMPROVING WASTE AND RECYCLING SYSTEMS
7 IN THE STATE, INCLUDING BY FACILITATING:

8 (I) THE IMPROVEMENT OF REUSE, COMPOSTING, AND
9 RECYCLING;

10 (II) THE IMPROVEMENT OF RECYCLING MARKETS;

11 (III) THE REDUCTION OF WASTE; AND

12 (IV) AN INCREASE IN RECYCLING RATES; AND

13 (2) REIMBURSING LOCAL GOVERNMENTS FOR COSTS ASSOCIATED
14 WITH TRANSPORTING, COLLECTING, AND PROCESSING PACKAGING MATERIALS.

16 (A) THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO A PRODUCER THAT:

17 (1) (I) GENERATED LESS THAN \$1,000,000 IN GROSS REVENUE
18 DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR;

19 (II) SOLD, OFFERED FOR SALE, OR DISTRIBUTED FOR SALE IN
20 THE STATE DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR LESS THAN 1
21 TON OF PACKAGING MATERIALS; OR

22 (III) CONDUCTED ALL OF THE PACKAGING MATERIALS SALES IN
23 THE STATE DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR AT A SINGLE
24 POINT OF RETAIL SALE THAT WAS NOT SUPPLIED OR OPERATED AS PART OF A
25 FRANCHISE; AND

26 (2) ON REQUEST BY THE DEPARTMENT, PROVIDES TO THE
27 DEPARTMENT SUFFICIENT INFORMATION TO DEMONSTRATE THAT THE PRODUCER
28 MEETS THE CONDITIONS OF THIS SECTION.

1 **(B) THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT AFFECT THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OR A**
2 **LOCAL JURISDICTION TO REGULATE THE SALE OR USE OF ANY PACKAGING**
3 **MATERIAL.**

4 **(C) THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT PROHIBIT A PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY**
5 **ORGANIZATION FROM ESTABLISHING A DEPOSIT-RETURN SYSTEM AS ONE**
6 **STRATEGY FOR INCREASING THE CAPTURE AND RECYCLING OF BEVERAGE**
7 **CONTAINERS OR OTHER PACKAGING MATERIALS.**

8 **9-2404.**

9 **(A) (1) (I) ON OR BEFORE APRIL 1, 2024, EACH PRODUCER SHALL,**
10 **INDIVIDUALLY OR AS PART OF A PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATION,**
11 **SUBMIT A PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR REVIEW**
12 **AND APPROVAL.**

13 **(II) IF MORE THAN ONE PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY**
14 **ORGANIZATION SUBMITS A PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN TO THE**
15 **DEPARTMENT:**

16 **1. THE PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATIONS**
17 **SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE DEPARTMENT AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO**
18 **ENSURE THAT:**

19 **A. RECYCLING SERVICES FOR RESIDENTS IN THE STATE**
20 **ARE PROVIDED IN A SEAMLESS MANNER; AND**

21 **B. PUBLIC OUTREACH, EDUCATION, AND**
22 **COMMUNICATION ARE PROVIDED IN A CONSISTENT MANNER; AND**

23 **2. THE PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATIONS**
24 **MAY CREATE A REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION TO REPRESENT ALL**
25 **PARTICIPATING PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE**
26 **REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

27 **(III) BEFORE SUBMITTING THE PLAN REQUIRED UNDER THIS**
28 **SUBSECTION TO THE DEPARTMENT, A PRODUCER OR PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY**
29 **ORGANIZATION SHALL CONSULT WITH THE ADVISORY COUNCIL ESTABLISHED**
30 **UNDER § 9-2405 OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

31 **(2) ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2024, A PRODUCER MAY NOT SELL,**
32 **OFFER FOR SALE, DISTRIBUTE, OR IMPORT FOR SALE OR DISTRIBUTION PACKAGING**
33 **MATERIALS FOR USE IN THE STATE UNLESS THE PRODUCER, INDIVIDUALLY OR AS**

1 PART OF A PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATION, HAS AN APPROVED
2 PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN ON FILE WITH THE DEPARTMENT.

3 (B) A PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY PLAN SHALL:

4 (1) IDENTIFY THE PRODUCERS COVERED BY THE PLAN, INCLUDING
5 THE CONTACT INFORMATION FOR EACH PARTICIPATING PRODUCER AND THE
6 PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY ORGANIZATION;

7 (2) IDENTIFY EACH BRAND OF PACKAGING MATERIALS COVERED BY
8 THE PLAN;

9 (3) REQUIRE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS
10 SECTION, ACHIEVEMENT WITHIN 5 YEARS AFTER THE DATE ON WHICH THE FIRST
11 VERSION OF THE PLAN IS APPROVED AND ESTABLISH THE FOLLOWING
12 PERFORMANCE GOALS, AS RELEVANT, FOR EACH PACKAGING MATERIAL TYPE:

13 (I) POSTCONSUMER RECYCLED CONTENT GOALS;

14 (II) RECYCLABILITY AND RECYCLING RATE GOALS;

15 (III) REUSE GOALS;

16 (IV) PACKAGING REDUCTION GOALS;

17 (V) COMPOST ACCESS OR COMPOST RATE GOALS, IF
18 APPLICABLE AND TECHNOLOGICALLY AND ENVIRONMENTALLY FEASIBLE;

19 (VI) CONTAMINATION REDUCTION RATE GOALS;

20 (VII) GREENHOUSE GAS REDUCTION GOALS; AND

21 (VIII) ANY OTHER GOAL THAT DEMONSTRATES POSITIVE
22 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT AND IS JUSTIFIED IN THE PLAN;

23 (4) REQUIRE EACH PARTICIPATING PRODUCER TO REDUCE ALL
24 PACKAGING MATERIAL WASTE TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PRACTICABLE, AND BY
25 NOT LESS THAN 25% FOR EACH PACKAGING MATERIAL TYPE, WITHIN 5 YEARS AFTER
26 THE DATE ON WHICH THE FIRST VERSION OF THE PLAN IS APPROVED;
