BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Environment Section 9–1701(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Environment Section 9–1701(p) and (t) through (w) and 9–1703(e) through (g) Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) BY repealing Article – Environment
