1 AN ACT concerning

Montgomery County - Town of Kensington - Alcoholic Beverages - Special B-K Licenses

FOR the purpose of altering the description of commercial areas in the Town of Kensington in Montgomery County in which the Board of License Commissioners may issue special B-K alcoholic beverages licenses for use on the premises of restaurants located in those areas; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in the Town of Kensington in Montgomery County.

18 (a) (2) (iv) 1. In the town of Kensington, the Montgomery County 19 Board of License Commissioners may issue a special B–K beer and wine license or a 20 special B–K beer, wine and liquor license for use on the premises of a restaurant 21 located in the following commercial areas:

A. The west side of Connecticut Avenue between Knowles Avenue and Perry Avenue;
