A BILL ENTITLED

Maryland Health Care Commission – Uterine Fibroids – Study

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, certain experts, and interested stakeholders, to conduct a study of issues related to the incidence of uterine fibroids in the State; requiring the study to examine certain issues; requiring, on or before a certain date, the Commission to report certain findings to certain committees of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the Maryland Health Care Commission and a study of uterine fibroids.
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 11 That:
- 12 (a) The Maryland Health Care Commission, in consultation with the Department 13 of Health and Mental Hygiene, experts in uterine fibroids, and interested stakeholders, 14 shall conduct a study of issues related to the incidence of uterine fibroids in the State.
- 15 (b) The study conducted under subsection (a) of this section shall examine:
- 16 (1) the incidence of uterine fibroids among women in the State, by race, ethnicity, age, and county of residence;
- 18 (2) the types of treatments and procedures used to treat uterine fibroids;
- 19 (3) data on the number of women in the State who undergo a hysterectomy, 20 myomectomy, or other type of treatment for uterine fibroids each year;
- 21 (4) alternative, innovative, and less invasive treatments and procedures 22 that are available to treat uterine fibroids:

- 1 (5) whether there is a need for more research to study the cause and 2 treatment of uterine fibroids; and
- 3 (6) whether licensed physicians in the State are willing and able to perform 4 less invasive procedures to treat uterine fibroids.
- 5 (c) On or before June 30, 2016, the Maryland Health Care Commission shall report, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the findings of the study conducted under subsection (a) of this section to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government Operations 9 Committee.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
