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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Environment – State Board of Waterworks and Waste Systems Operators –**  
3 **Sunset Extension and Revisions**

4 FOR the purpose of continuing the State Board of Waterworks and Waste Systems  
5 Operators in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program  
6 Evaluation Act (sunset law) by extending to a certain date the termination  
7 provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the Board;  
8 altering the composition of the Board; clarifying that the Department of the  
9 Environment is responsible for the enforcement of certain provisions; requiring  
10 that an evaluation of the Board and the statutes and regulations that relate to  
11 the Board be performed on or before a certain date; requiring the Board to  
12 submit a certain report on or before a certain date; repealing obsolete language;  
13 and generally relating to the State Board of Waterworks and Waste Systems  
14 Operators.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (c) (2) “Certificate” includes:

18 (i) A certificate; **AND**

19 (ii) A temporary certificate, as limited by § 12–305 of this title[;

23 (a) (2) With the advice and consent of the Senate, the Governor shall  
24 appoint 8 members who represent one or more of the following:

25 (i) Municipal government;

26 (ii) County government;

27 (iii) A sanitary or a metropolitan commission;

29 (v) Wastewater works or industrial wastewater works

15           (a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 12-309 of this subtitle, the Board  
16 may deny certification[, limited certification,] or temporary certification to any  
17 applicant, if the applicant:

18                   (1) Fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a  
19 certificate[,] OR temporary certificate[, or limited certificate] for the applicant or for  
20 another; or

21                   (2) Fraudulently or deceptively uses a certificate[,] OR temporary  
22 certificate[, or limited certificate].

23           (b) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 12-309 of this subtitle, the Board  
24 may reprimand any certificate holder, or suspend or revoke a certification[, limited  
25 certification,] or temporary certification, if:

26                   (1) The certificate holder:

27                           (i) Fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a  
28 certificate[,] OR temporary certificate[, or limited certificate] for the certificate holder  
29 or another; or

30                           (ii) Fraudulently or deceptively uses a certificate[,] OR  
31 temporary certificate[, or limited certificate]; or

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1,  
4 2011, the State Board of Waterworks and Waste Systems Operators, in conjunction  
5 with the Department of the Environment, shall submit a report to the Senate  
6 Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House  
7 Environmental Matters Committee, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State  
8 Government Article, on ~~the status of nonstatutory recommendations contained in the~~

10 ~~Operators conducted by the Department of Legislative Services, specifically:~~

9 compliance for facilities with circuit riders;

10 (4) the adoption of regulations establishing the Board's circuit rider  
11 experience crediting policy;

12 (5) workforce conditions, including retirement, turnover, and salary,  
13 that affect future facility compliance with the certified operator requirement;

14 (6) the options for upgrading the Board's administrative database and  
15 website, and the compatibility of the Board's administrative database with the  
16 Department of the Environment's databases;

17 (7) the use of the Department of the Environment's penalty authority  
18 and any recommended changes to that authority;

19 (8) preexamination training opportunities for operators;

20 (9) the status of implementing computer-based examinations; and

21 (10) the Board's ability to generate sufficient fee revenue for the  
22 General Fund to cover the Board's expenses.

23 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
24 October 1, 2010.
