FOR the purpose of providing that, for certain purposes, the term "transfer" includes a loan other than a certain exchange of a regulated firearm between two individuals under certain circumstances providing that a firearms dealer or other person may not loan a regulated firearm to a certain person under certain circumstances; providing that a dealer or other person may not sell, rent, transfer, or loan a regulated firearm to a certain person knows or has reason to believe intends to commit a certain crime or cause certain harm; providing that a person who is the
