CHAPTER

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Hospitals – Changes in Status – Hospital Employee Retraining and Economic Impact Statements <u>Placement</u>

FOR the purpose of requiring a hospital that voluntarily converts to a freestanding medical facility or is acquired by another hospital or health system downsizes to pay a fee directly to the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation if workers are displaced; prohibiting the fee from exceeding a certain percent of total revenue approved by the Health Services Cost Review Commission for a certain fiscal year; limiting the number of times the fee may be assessed; prohibiting a certain fee paid by a hospital that voluntarily closes, merges, or is delicensed from exceeding a certain percent of total revenue approved by the Health Services Cost Review Commission, rather than the gross operating revenue, for a certain fiscal year; requiring the Health Services Cost Review Commission to prorate the total amount of certain fees in a certain manner to derive a certain fee; prohibiting the Health Services Cost Review Commission from including certain employees if the Health Services Cost Review Commission uses the number of employees of a hospital who are affected by the closure, merger, downsizing, or delicensing of the hospital in calculating a certain fee; requiring a hospital to file with the Maryland Health Care Commission and provide to certain members of the General Assembly a certain economic impact statement within a certain time period; altering the purpose of a certain program the Department is required to establish to include the retraining and placement of hospital employees who are unemployed or may become unemployed as a result of the conversion of a hospital to a freestanding medical facility or the acquisition of one hospital by another hospital or health system; altering the purposes for which the Hospital Employees Retraining Fund is to be
