SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That: (a) There is a Police Recruitment and Retention Workgroup. (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members: (1)one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the Chair of the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee; (2)one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Chair of the House Judiciary Committee; the Secretary of the Department of State Police, or the Secretary's (3)designee; **(4)** the Public Defender, or the Public Defender's designee;

11 12 13 14	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2026 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
