

Chapter 272

(Senate Bill 407)

AN ACT concerning

Electricity – Net Energy Metering – Limit

FOR the purpose of altering the statewide limit on rated generating capacity for net energy metering under a certain contract or tariff available to certain eligible customer–generators; making a conforming change; and generally relating to electricity and net energy metering.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Public Utilities

7–306.

(d) The Commission shall require electric utilities to develop a standard contract or tariff for net energy metering and make it available to eligible customer–generators on a first–come, first–served basis until the rated generating capacity owned and operated by eligible customer–generators in the State reaches **[1,500] 3,000** megawatts.

7–306.2.

(g) The cumulative installed nameplate capacity under the pilot program shall count toward the overall limitation [of 1,500 megawatts] for all net metering projects [in] ESTABLISHED UNDER § 7–306(d) of this subtitle.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2021.
