AN ACT concerning 1

$\mathbf{2}$ Vehicle Laws – Driving in Right–Hand Lanes – Interstate Highways in Rural 3 Areas

FOR the purpose of requiring the driver of a vehicle traveling slower than the general speed 4 $\mathbf{5}$ of traffic on certain interstate highways to drive the vehicle in the right-hand lanes 6 under certain circumstances; prohibiting the issuance of a citation for a violation of 7 this Act; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to include information about the requirement in the State's driver education curriculum and to inform drivers of 8 9 the requirement through certain signage; and generally relating to driving in the right-hand lanes of a highway.

18 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2022.
