2 **Community Health and Safety Works Grant Program and Fund – Establishment**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Community Health and Safety Works Grant Program
4 in the Department of Housing and Community Development; establishing the
5 Community Health and Safety Works Grant Program Fund as a special, nonlapsing
6 fund to provide financial assistance in the form of grants under the provisions of the
7 Program for certain eligible projects; requiring interest earnings of the Fund to be
8 credited to the Fund; and generally relating to the Community Health and Safety
9 Works Grant Program and Fund.

20 PLANTINGS, OR OTHER UPGRADES TO PUBLIC SPACES;

9 **(I) A TAX-EXEMPT NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION;**

10 **(II) A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT FOR A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION; OR**

11 **(III) AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN**
12 **COLLABORATION WITH A LOCAL NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION.**

26 receive interest earnings, as accounted for by the Comptroller, shall accrue to the General
27 Fund of the State.
