# Department of the Environment – Supplemental Environmental Projects Database

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of the Environment to create and maintain
a certain database of supplemental environmental projects; requiring the
Department to solicit input from certain communities in creating and maintaining
the database; requiring the Department to ensure that the scope and cost of a chosen
supplemental environmental project is commensurate with the scope and cost of a
violation before a violator undertakes the project; defining a certain term; and
generally relating to a supplemental environmental projects database.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
   That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### Article – Environment

19 **1–305.** 

(A) IN THIS SECTION, "SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECT" MEANS
AN ENVIRONMENTALLY BENEFICIAL PROJECT OR ACTIVITY THAT IS NOT REQUIRED
BY LAW, BUT THAT AN ALLEGED VIOLATOR AGREES TO UNDERTAKE AS PART OF A
SETTLEMENT OR ENFORCEMENT ACTION.

24 (B) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE





1 DEPARTMENT SHALL CREATE AND MAINTAIN A DATABASE OF SUPPLEMENTAL 2 ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS FROM WHICH A PERSON THAT VIOLATES THIS ARTICLE 3 MAY CHOOSE TO UNDERTAKE.

4 (2) IN CREATING AND MAINTAINING THE DATABASE, THE 5 DEPARTMENT SHALL SOLICIT INPUT FROM COMMUNITIES IN THE STATE THAT ARE 6 MOST IMPACTED BY ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE ISSUES.

7 (C) BEFORE A VIOLATOR UNDERTAKES A SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL 8 PROJECT, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENSURE THAT THE SCOPE AND COST OF THE 9 CHOSEN PROJECT IS COMMENSURATE WITH THE SCOPE AND COST OF THE 10 VIOLATION.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 2021.
