## Public Ethics Laws - Meals - Regulated Lobbyist Reporting Requirements

- FOR the purpose of requiring a regulated lobbyist that invites certain members of the General Assembly to a meal during the legislative session to file a certain report with the State Ethics Commission by a certain date each year disclosing the names of certain members of the General Assembly who consumed food and beverages at the meal; providing for the contents of the report; and generally relating to regulated lobbyist reporting requirements.

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- (d) (1) (i) A regulated lobbyist who is required to register under subsection (a) of this section shall report the total cost of the meal or reception, including the identity of any sponsor who contributes to the cost and the amount of the contribution, to the Ethics Commission within 14 days after the date of the meal or reception.
- (ii) Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, if any information required under subparagraph (i) is not known within 14 days after the date of the meal or reception, the regulated lobbyist shall, as to the information not known, specify the nature and estimate the amount of each item.
- (2) If all of the information required by paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection is reported accurately and completely, the regulated lobbyist is not required to report the cost of the meal or reception under § 15–704(b)(2)(vii) of this subtitle.
- 13 (3) The State Ethics Commission shall allow public inspection of any registration report required under this subsection during regular business hours.
