

(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

"Qualifying offense" means:

- 4 (i) unnatural or perverted sexual practice under § 3–322 of the 5 Criminal Law Article, AS THAT OFFENSE EXISTED BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2023;
- 6 (b) A person convicted of a qualifying offense may file a motion to vacate the 7 judgment if the person's participation in the offense was a direct result of being a victim of 8 human trafficking.

- 10 (a) A person who has been charged with the commission of a crime, including a 11 violation of the Transportation Article for which a term of imprisonment may be imposed, 12 or who has been charged with a civil offense or infraction, except a juvenile offense, may 13 file a petition listing relevant facts for expungement of a police record, court record, or other 14 record maintained by the State or a political subdivision of the State if:
- 15 (11) except as provided in subsection (a–1) of this section, the person was 16 convicted of a crime and the act on which the conviction was based is no longer a crime;
