Vehicle Laws - Passing Bicycles, Personal Mobility Devices, or Motor Scooters

- FOR the purpose of requiring that when overtaking a bicycle, an electric personal assistive mobility device (EPAMD), or a motor scooter, the driver of a vehicle is required to pass at a safe speed; repealing a certain exception to a certain requirement that a driver overtake and pass a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter in a certain manner that applies when a highway lacks sufficient width; and generally relating to rules of the road for overtaking and passing bicycles, EPAMDs, or motor scooters.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article – Transportation

- 17 21–1209.
- 18 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, the driver of a vehicle shall:
- 19 (1) Exercise due care to avoid colliding with any bicycle, EPAMD, or motor 20 scooter being ridden by a person; and
- 21 (2) When overtaking a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter, pass safely

- 2(II) A distance of not less than 3 feet, unless, at the time:
- 3 (i) 1. The bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter rider fails to operate 4 the vehicle in conformance with § 21–1205(a) of this subtitle ("Riding to right side of roadway") or § 21–1205.1(b) of this subtitle ("Roadway with bike lane or shoulder paved to 5 smooth surface"); OR 6
- 7 [(ii)] **2.** A passing clearance of less than 3 feet is caused solely by 8 the bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter rider failing to maintain a steady course [; or
- 9 (iii) The highway on which the vehicle is being driven is not wide enough to lawfully pass the bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter at a distance of at least 3 10 feet1. 11
- 12 A person may not throw any object at or in the direction of any person riding a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter. 13
- 14 A person may not open the door of any motor vehicle with intent to strike, 15 injure, or interfere with any person riding a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter.
- 16 (d) Unless otherwise specified in this title, the driver of a vehicle shall yield the 17 right-of-way to a person who is lawfully riding a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter in 18 a designated bike lane or shoulder if the driver of the vehicle is about to enter or cross the designated bike lane or shoulder. 19
- 20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 October 1, 2015.
