Oyster Poaching - Administrative Penalties

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a requirement that the Department of Natural Resources hold a certain hearing within a certain number of days after altering the number of 4 5 days within which the Department of Natural Resources is required to hold a certain 6 hearing for a person who holds a certain license an authorization to catch oysters 7 and receives a citation for a certain offense; requiring the Department to hold a 8 certain hearing before the revocation of an authorization to catch oysters under 9 certain provisions of law establishing that the Department is not required to hold a 10 certain hearing if an assistant Attorney General assigned to the Department 11 determines that it is unable to establish the facts necessary to succeed in the hearing; 12 requiring the Department to report on administrative penalties imposed for certain 13 oyster poaching to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain 14 date each year; making certain technical changes; providing for the termination of 15 this Act; and generally relating to administrative penalties for oyster poaching.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 3 (a) (1) In addition to any other penalty or fine provided in this title, a person who holds [a license] AN AUTHORIZATION to catch oysters under § 4–701 of this title and Freceives a citation for COMMITS an offense listed under paragraph (2) of this subsection may have the [license] AUTHORIZATION revoked in accordance with this section.
- 7 (2) The following offenses, committed in violation of this title or of any 8 regulation adopted under this title, are grounds for revocation of [a license] AN 9 AUTHORIZATION to catch oysters under this section:
- 10 (i) Taking oysters located more than 200 feet within a closed or 11 prohibited area;
- 12 (ii) Taking oysters with gear that is prohibited in that area;
- 13 (iii) Taking oysters outside of a time restriction for the harvest of 14 oysters by more than 1 hour;
- 15 (iv) Taking oysters during closed seasons; and
- 16 (v) Taking oysters from a leased area by a person other than the 17 leaseholder or the leaseholder's designee.
- 18 (b) (1) (I) Within EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF
 19 THIS PARAGRAPH, WITHIN 60 90 days after a person who holds a license AN

- 29 (2) After a hearing is conducted under paragraph (1) of this subsection, if 30 the presiding officer finds or concludes that the person knowingly has committed an offense 31 listed under subsection (a)(2) of this section, the Department shall revoke the person's 32 [license] AUTHORIZATION to catch oysters.

1 2 3	(c) A person who is aggrieved by the final decision of the Department may obtain judicial review of the decision in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act under Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the State Government Article.
4 5 6	(d) A person whose [license] AUTHORIZATION has been revoked in accordance with this section may not engage or work in the OYSTER fishery [for which the license was revoked] whether or not it requires the use of another license.
7 8 9 10	(E) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31 EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT TO THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE ENVIRONMENT AND TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON:
11 12	(1) THE NUMBER OF CITATIONS ISSUED DURING THE PREVIOUS YEAR FOR OFFENSES LISTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION; AND
13 14	(2) THE ACTION TAKEN OR PENALTY IMPOSED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND THE COURT FOR EACH OFFENSE.
15 16 17 18	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 2021 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
