### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Maryland Small Business Innovation Research and Technology Transfer Incentive Program

- FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Small Business Innovation Research and 4  $\mathbf{5}$ Technology Transfer Incentive Program in the Department of Commerce; 6 establishing the purposes of the Program; establishing qualifications for 7 participation in the Program; authorizing the Program to provide certain grants to 8 certain businesses on a first-come, first-served basis, subject to certain limitations; 9 providing for the coordination of certain activities of the Program with comparable county programs; providing that a certain grant recipient may be required to return 1011 certain funds under certain circumstances; establishing the Maryland Small 12Business Innovation Research and Technology Transfer Incentive Matching Fund as 13 a special, nonlapsing fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the Secretary of Commerce to administer the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold 14 15the Fund, and the Comptroller to account for the Fund; specifying the contents of the 16Fund; specifying the purpose for which the Fund may be used; providing for the 17investment of money in and expenditures from the Fund; requiring interest earnings 18 of the Fund to be credited to the Fund: requiring the Secretary to review and evaluate 19the Program on a periodic basis; authorizing the Secretary to submit certain 20recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly; authorizing the 21 Secretary to adopt certain regulations; exempting the Fund from a certain provision 22of law requiring interest earnings on State money to accrue to the General Fund of 23the State; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Maryland Small 24Business Innovation Research and Technology Transfer Incentive Program.

1 (E) "SMALL BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER GRANT" MEANS A GRANT 2 AWARDED UNDER THE SMALL BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER GRANT 3 PROGRAM BY THE NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH FOR A BUSINESS TO ENGAGE 4 IN RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT THAT HAS A STRONG POTENTIAL FOR 5 COMMERCIALIZATION.

7 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND SMALL BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH AND 8 TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER INCENTIVE PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT.

9 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO FOSTER JOB CREATION AND 10 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN THE STATE BY:

11(1) PROMOTING THE COMMERCIALIZATION OF RESEARCH12CONDUCTED BY SMALL BUSINESSES IN THE STATE;

13(2)FACILITATING THE TRANSFER OF TECHNOLOGY FROM SMALL14BUSINESSES; AND

15 (3) ENCOURAGING SMALL BUSINESSES TO APPLY FOR SMALL 16 BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH GRANTS AND SMALL BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY 17 TRANSFER GRANTS.

19 (A) TO QUALIFY FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM, A SMALL BUSINESS 20 SHALL MEET THE CRITERIA IN THIS SECTION.

- 21 (B) THE SMALL BUSINESS MUST:
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(1) MAINTAIN ITS PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS IN THE STATE;

(2) HAVE RECEIVED A PHASE I OR PHASE II SMALL BUSINESS
 INNOVATION RESEARCH GRANT OR SMALL BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER
 GRANT IN THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR; AND

26 (3) CONDUCT AT LEAST 51% OF ITS RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT 27 OPERATIONS AT A PHYSICAL LOCATION IN THE STATE.

(C) A GRANT RECIPIENT THAT FAILS TO FULFILL THE ELIGIBILITY AND
 MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS OF THE PROGRAM, OR OF A COMPARABLE COUNTY
 PROGRAM THAT SUPPORTS THE RECIPIENT, MAY BE REQUIRED TO RETURN ALL OR
 PART OF THE GRANT TO THE PROGRAM.

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1 (D) THE PROGRAM SHALL REQUIRE A SMALL BUSINESS TO RETURN TO THE 2 DEPARTMENT ANY MONEY FROM A MATCHING GRANT UNDER THIS SUBTITLE IF THE 3 BUSINESS DOES NOT REMAIN IN THE STATE FOR AT LEAST 2 YEARS AFTER 4 RECEIVING THE GRANT PAYMENT.

6 (A) AN APPLICANT SHALL SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR A PROGRAM 7 GRANT ON THE FORM THAT THE SECRETARY REQUIRES.

8 (B) THE PROGRAM SHALL REVIEW THE APPLICATION AND ALL SUPPORTING 9 MATERIALS TO EVALUATE WHETHER THE APPLICANT QUALIFIES FOR A GRANT 10 FROM THE PROGRAM.

11 (C) SUBJECT TO THE AVAILABILITY OF MONEY IN THE FUND, THE 12 PROGRAM MAY PROVIDE TO AN ELIGIBLE SMALL BUSINESS A MATCHING GRANT FOR 13 A SMALL BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH GRANT OR SMALL BUSINESS 14 TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER GRANT.

15 (D) A SMALL BUSINESS THAT IS AWARDED A MATCHING GRANT FOR A PHASE 16 I SMALL BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH GRANT OR SMALL BUSINESS 17 TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER GRANT SHALL RECEIVE A MATCHING GRANT AMOUNT 18 THAT IS THE LESSER OF:

19(1)25% OF THE PHASE I SMALL BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH20GRANT OR SMALL BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER GRANT; OR

21 **(2) \$25,000.** 

22 (E) A SMALL BUSINESS THAT IS AWARDED A MATCHING GRANT FOR A PHASE 23 II SMALL BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH GRANT OR SMALL BUSINESS 24 TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER GRANT SHALL RECEIVE A MATCHING GRANT AMOUNT 25 THAT IS THE LESSER OF:

26 (1) 25% OF A PHASE II SMALL BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH 27 GRANT OR SMALL BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER GRANT; OR

**28 (2) \$75,000**.

29 (F) DURING EACH FISCAL YEAR A SMALL BUSINESS MAY NOT RECEIVE 30 MORE THAN ONE MATCHING GRANT. 1 (G) A SMALL BUSINESS MAY NOT RECEIVE MORE THAN FIVE MATCHING 2 GRANTS UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

3 (H) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL AWARD MATCHING GRANTS ON A 4 FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVED BASIS.

5 (I) THE PROGRAM SHALL COORDINATE WITH COMPARABLE COUNTY 6 PROGRAMS TO EVALUATE APPLICATIONS AND TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO 7 ELIGIBLE BUSINESSES UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

8 **5–1705.** 

9 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND SMALL BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH AND 10 TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER INCENTIVE MATCHING FUND.

11 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO PROVIDE MATCHING FUNDS TO 12 FURTHER STIMULATE INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND ATTRACT EARLY 13 STAGE SMALL BUSINESSES ENGAGED IN RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT.

14 (C) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND.

15 (D) (1) THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT 16 SUBJECT TO REVERSION UNDER § 7–302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND 17 PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

18 (2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND SEPARATELY, 19 AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.

- 20 (E) THE FUND CONSISTS OF:
- 21 (1) MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE FUND;

## 22 (2) MONEY RECAPTURED FROM BUSINESSES THAT FAIL TO FULFILL 23 THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF A GRANT MADE FROM THE PROGRAM;

24 (3) INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND; AND

25(4) ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED FOR26THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.

- 27 (F) THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY FOR:
- 28 (1) MATCHING GRANTS THAT COUNTIES OR THE FEDERAL

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GOVERNMENT PROVIDE TO ELIGIBLE BUSINESSES UNDER COMPARABLE SMALL
 BUSINESS INNOVATION RESEARCH OR SMALL BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER
 GRANT PROGRAMS; AND

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(2) ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES OF THE PROGRAM.

5 (G) (1) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE FUND 6 IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.

7 (2) INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE 8 FUND.

9 (H) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN ACCORDANCE 10 WITH THE STATE BUDGET.

11 **5–1706.** 

12 (A) AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 3 YEARS, THE SECRETARY SHALL REVIEW AND 13 EVALUATE THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING THE NUMBER AND SIZE OF ELIGIBLE 14 BUSINESSES THAT RECEIVE SUPPORT FROM THE PROGRAM.

15 (B) BASED ON THE REVIEW AND EVALUATION, THE SECRETARY MAY 16 SUBMIT RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF THE 17 STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE CONTINUED 18 EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROGRAM.

20 THE SECRETARY MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS SUBTITLE.

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#### **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

22 6-226.

(a) (2) (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and unless
inconsistent with a federal law, grant agreement, or other federal requirement or with the
terms of a gift or settlement agreement, net interest on all State money allocated by the
State Treasurer under this section to special funds or accounts, and otherwise entitled to
receive interest earnings, as accounted for by the Comptroller, shall accrue to the General
Fund of the State.
