4 FOR the purpose of clarifying that part-time physicians and physician assistants are $\mathbf{5}$ eligible for participation in the Maryland Loan Assistance Repayment Program for 6 Physicians and Physician Assistants; authorizing the Maryland Department of 7 Health to establish prorated loan repayment assistance for part-time physicians and 8 physician assistants; establishing the Maryland Loan Assistance Repayment 9 Program Advisory Council for Physicians and Physician Assistants to assist the 10 Department in the administration of the Program; and generally relating to the 11 Maryland Loan Assistance Repayment Program for Physicians and Physician Assistants. 12

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Health - General

4 24–1703.

5 There is a Maryland Loan Assistance Repayment Program for Physicians and 6 Physician Assistants in the State.

7 24-1704.

8 (a) (1) In this section[, "eligible] THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 9 MEANINGS INDICATED.

10 (2) (I) "ELIGIBLE field of employment" means employment by an 11 organization, institution, association, society, or corporation that is exempt from taxation 12 under § 501(c)(3) or (4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

13 [(2)] (II) "Eligible field of employment" includes employment by the State 14 or any local government in the State.

15 (3) "PHYSICIAN" INCLUDES A PART-TIME PHYSICIAN.

16 (4) "PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT" INCLUDES A PART-TIME PHYSICIAN 17 ASSISTANT.

18 (b) (1) The Department shall assist in the repayment with the funds 19 transferred to the Department by the Comptroller under § 14–207(d) of the Health 20 Occupations Article of the amount of education loans owed by a physician or physician 21 assistant who:

[(1)] (i) **1.** Practices primary care in an eligible field of employment in a geographic area of the State that has been federally designated; or

- [(ii)] 2. Is a medical resident specializing in primary care who agrees to practice for at least 2 years as a primary care physician in an eligible field of employment in a geographic area of the State that has been federally designated; and
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[(2)] (II) Meets any other requirements established by the Department.

28 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ESTABLISH PRORATED LOAN REPAYMENT 29 ASSISTANCE FOR A PART-TIME PHYSICIAN OR PART-TIME PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT 30 PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAM.

1 (c) Any unspent portions of the money that is transferred to the Department for 2 use under this subtitle from the Board of Physicians Fund may not be transferred to or 3 revert to the General Fund of the State, but shall remain in the Fund maintained by the 4 Department to administer the Program.

6 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "COUNCIL" MEANS THE MARYLAND LOAN 7 ASSISTANCE REPAYMENT PROGRAM ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR PHYSICIANS AND 8 PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS.

9 (B) THERE IS A MARYLAND LOAN ASSISTANCE REPAYMENT PROGRAM 10 ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR PHYSICIANS AND PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS.

11 (C) THE COUNCIL CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

12 (1) THE CHAIR OF THE HEALTH SERVICES COST REVIEW 13 COMMISSION, OR THE CHAIR'S DESIGNEE;

14 (2) THE CHAIR OF THE MARYLAND HEALTH CARE COMMISSION, OR 15 THE CHAIR'S DESIGNEE;

16 (3) THE PRESIDENT OF THE MARYLAND HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION, OR 17 THE PRESIDENT'S DESIGNEE;

18 (4) THE DEAN OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND SCHOOL OF 19 MEDICINE, OR THE DEAN'S DESIGNEE;

20 (5) THE DEAN OF THE JOHNS HOPKINS SCHOOL OF MEDICINE, OR 21 THE DEAN'S DESIGNEE;

22 (6) THE PRESIDENT OF MEDCHI, OR THE PRESIDENT'S DESIGNEE;

23 (7) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE PRIMARY CARE OFFICE IN THE 24 OFFICE OF POPULATION HEALTH IMPROVEMENT;

25 (8) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHYSICIANS;

26 (9) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND ACADEMY OF 27 Physician Assistants; and

28 (10) ANY OTHER MEMBERS AS DETERMINED NECESSARY BY THE 29 SECRETARY.

THE MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL SELECT THE CHAIR OF 1 (D) (1) $\mathbf{2}$ THE COUNCIL. A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL: 3 (2) 4 **(I)** MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE $\mathbf{5}$ **COUNCIL; BUT** 6 (II) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER 7 THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET. 8 (3) 9 THE COUNCIL SHALL MEET AT LEAST THREE TIMES A YEAR. 10 **(E)** THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COUNCIL. THE COUNCIL SHALL: 11 **(F)** 12 (1) SEEK PERMANENT AND DIVERSE REVENUE SOURCES TO AID IN THE STABILITY AND FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF THE PROGRAM; 1314(2) HELP ENSURE MAXIMUM USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS; USE AVAILABLE DATA AND INFORMATION TO HELP DIRECT 15(3) FUNDING TO PRIORITY AREAS; 16 17(4) MONITOR SIMILAR LOAN PROGRAMS IN OTHER STATES AND 18 ENSURE THAT THE PROGRAM REMAINS COMPETITIVE; ASSIST THE DEPARTMENT IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE 19 (5) **PROGRAM**; 2021(6) HELP MARKET AND RAISE AWARENESS OF THE PROGRAM 22THROUGH EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND OTHER APPROPRIATE ENTITIES AS AN 23INCENTIVE TO HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS TO PRACTICE IN UNDERSERVED AREAS; 24AND 25(7) Make recommendations to the Governor and the 26GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON ANY NECESSARY CHANGES TO THE PROGRAM. 27(G) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE COUNCIL SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE 28GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE ACTIVITIES AND
