1 AN ACT concerning

2 Economic Development - Maryland Tourism Development Board - Grants 3 Task Force on the Tourism Industry in Maryland

- 4 FOR the purpose of expanding the requirement that the Maryland Tourism Development Board provide grants to certain tourism organizations by including nongovernmental 5 6 tourism organizations as authorized recipients of grants from the Board; and 7 generally relating to the Maryland Tourism Development Board establishing the 8 Task Force on the Tourism Industry in Maryland; providing for the composition, 9 chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from 10 receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain 11 expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and 12 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain 13 date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task 14 Force on the Tourism Industry in Maryland. 15
