## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Environment - Commission on Environmental Justice and Sustainable Communities - Reform

4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Commission on Environmental Justice  $\mathbf{5}$ and Sustainable Communities; requiring the membership of the Commission to 6 reflect the diversity of the State to the extent practicable; specifying the term of 7 certain members; requiring the Department of the Environment to provide a new 8 member with a certain orientation; altering the manner in which a chair is chosen 9 for the Commission; requiring the Commission to meet a minimum number of times 10 per calendar year; requiring the Commission to hold a certain number of meetings 11 in certain locations of the State; requiring the Commission to use data sets and 12mapping tools to review and analyze the current impact of State laws and policies on 13 certain issues; requiring the Commission to coordinate with the Commission on 14 Climate Change on certain recommendations; repealing the requirement that the 15Commission develop certain criteria; requiring the Commission, after seeking input 16from and hosting meetings in certain communities, to create a list of potential 17supplemental environmental projects to address environmental justice issues; 18 requiring the Commission to recommend certain options to the General Assembly; 19defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Commission on Environmental 20Justice and Sustainable Communities.

Article, the General Assembly.
