13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 18 19	(a) In addition to the duties set forth elsewhere in this subtitle, the EMS Board shall develop and adopt an Emergency Medical System plan to ensure effective coordination and evaluation of emergency medical services delivered in this State.
20	(b) (1) The Emergency Medical System plan shall include:

- 1 (ii) Criteria and guidelines for the delivery of emergency medical services including provisions to assure proper medical direction of emergency medical services;
- 4 (iii) A plan designed to maintain and enhance the communications 5 and transportation systems for emergency medical services;
- 6 (iv) Provisions for the evaluation of emergency medical services 7 personnel training programs;
- 8 (v) Provisions for the establishment of public information and 9 education programs designed to enhance the public's understanding of the Emergency 10 Medical System;

- 22 1. AUTHORIZE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES TO BE 23 PROVIDED TO A CANINE AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY;
- 24 **2.** AUTHORIZE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL TO TRANSPORT THE CANINE TO A DESIGNATED VETERINARY FACILITY 26 AND TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO THE CANINE DURING TRANSPORT;
- 3. Grant immunity from criminal and civil liability for emergency medical services personnel who provide services to the canine in good faith; and
- 4. PROHIBIT EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
 PERSONNEL FROM PROVIDING SERVICES TO A CANINE IF THE PERSONNEL ARE
 NEEDED CONCURRENTLY TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO INDIVIDUALS.
- 33 (2) The EMS Board shall adopt regulations to implement the Emergency 34 Medical System plan required under this section, subject to paragraph (3) of this

1 subsection.

- 2 (3) Prior to adopting regulations under this section, the EMS Board shall consult with and provide opportunity for comment from local jurisdictions, volunteer and career fire companies, emergency medical technicians, rescue squad personnel, and hospitals and consider:
- 6 (i) The fiscal impact of the proposed regulations on local 7 jurisdictions, volunteer and career fire companies, emergency medical technicians, rescue 8 squad personnel, and hospitals; and
- 9 (ii) The effect of the proposed regulations on the ability of local 10 jurisdictions, volunteer and career fire companies, emergency medical technicians, rescue 11 squad personnel, and hospitals to continue to deliver emergency medical services.
- 12 (c) The EMS Board shall consult with the Advisory Council in the development 13 of the Emergency Medical System plan.
- 14 (d) The EMS Board may adopt regulations that assure that helicopters 15 transporting patients between hospitals or to or from specialty centers notify the System's 16 communication center in the State Emergency Medical Communications System.
- 17 (e) Each State agency and department shall cooperate with the EMS Board in 18 implementing the State Emergency Medical System plan.
- 19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 20 1, 2022.
