A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – State Fuel Security Program**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the State Fuel Security Program to be administered and
4 enforced by the Maryland Energy Administration for the management and
5 distribution of certain energy resources during an energy emergency; establishing
6 fuel percentages under the Program; designating certain activities for which an
7 assignment of fuel may be issued under the Program during an energy emergency
8 and authorizing the Administration to set priorities for fuel assignments under
9 certain circumstances; requiring a certain entity to designate a representative to act
10 on behalf of the entity and requiring an assignment issued under the Program during
11 an energy emergency to be honored by the entity; establishing an appeals process for
12 the issuance of an assignment by the Administration; authorizing the
13 Administration, in coordination with the Department of Emergency Management
14 and the Department of Information Technology, to collect, store, and disseminate
15 certain energy-related data for a certain purpose and subject to certain
16 requirements; requiring certain entities to provide the Administration with certain
17 information under certain circumstances; authorizing the Attorney General to bring
18 a certain civil suit under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the State
19 Fuel Security Program.

4 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
5 INDICATED.6 (B) “ADMINISTRATION” MEANS THE MARYLAND ENERGY
7 ADMINISTRATION.8 (C) “ASSIGNMENT” MEANS A WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION BY THE
9 ADMINISTRATION THAT ORDERS A SPECIFIED SUPPLIER TO SUPPLY STATE FUEL
10 SECURITY PRODUCTS TO A SPECIFIED PURCHASER.

11 (D) “DIRECTOR” MEANS THE DIRECTOR OF THE ADMINISTRATION.

12 (E) “ENERGY EMERGENCY” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 14–301 OF THIS
13 TITLE.14 (F) “PERSON” INCLUDES A FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT OR
15 AN AGENCY OR INSTRUMENTALITY OF A FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT.16 (G) “PRIME SUPPLIER” MEANS A SUPPLIER THAT MAKES THE FIRST SALE
17 INTO THE STATE DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM OF A STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT
18 THAT IS INTENDED FOR CONSUMPTION IN THE STATE.

19 (H) “PROGRAM” MEANS THE STATE FUEL SECURITY PROGRAM.

20 (I) “STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT” MEANS A PRODUCT TO WHICH THE
21 PROGRAM APPLIES.22 (J) “STATE FUEL SECURITY VOLUME” MEANS THE STATE FUEL SECURITY
23 PERCENTAGE LEVEL FOR A PARTICULAR STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT APPLIED
24 TO A PARTICULAR PRIME SUPPLIER’S ESTIMATED PART OF ITS TOTAL SUPPLY FOR
25 A PARTICULAR TIME PERIOD THAT WILL BE SOLD INTO THE STATE DISTRIBUTION

3 (1) **PURCHASES, RECEIVES THROUGH TRANSFER, OR OTHERWISE**
4 **OBTAINS, INCLUDING BY CONSIGNMENT, A STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT; AND**

5 (2) **RESELLS OR OTHERWISE TRANSFERS THE STATE FUEL SECURITY**
6 **PRODUCT TO OTHER PURCHASERS WITHOUT SUBSTANTIALLY CHANGING ITS FORM.**

8 (A) **THERE IS A STATE FUEL SECURITY PROGRAM.**

9 (B) **THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL MAINTAIN PLANS AND PROCEDURES TO**
10 **CARRY OUT THE PROGRAM FOR USE DURING AN ENERGY EMERGENCY.**

11 (C) **THE DIRECTOR SHALL ADMINISTER AND ENFORCE THE PROGRAM.**

12 (D) **THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS FOR THE**
13 **ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

15 **ASSIGNMENT OF STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT THROUGH THE PROGRAM TO A**
16 **PERSON IF THE PERSON IS ENGAGED IN:**

17 **(1) AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION FOR THE COMMERCIAL**
18 **PRODUCTION OF FOOD, INCLUDING:**

19 **(I) FARMING;**

20 **(II) RANCHING;**

21 **(III) DAIRYING;**

22 **(IV) FISHING; AND**

23 **(V) RELATED SUPPORT SERVICES;**

24 **(2) CARGO FREIGHT AND MAIL HAULING BY TRUCKS AND MAIL**
25 **CARRIERS;**

1 **(3) THE OPERATION OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE CONGREGATE CARE**
2 **FACILITIES TO LODGE AND CARE FOR INDIVIDUALS WHOSE PLACES OF LODGING ARE**
3 **RENDERED UNINHABITABLE DUE TO THE ENERGY EMERGENCY;**

4 **(4) EMERGENCY SERVICES, INCLUDING:**

5 **(I) LAW ENFORCEMENT;**

6 **(II) FIRE FIGHTING;**

7 **(III) EMERGENCY ROAD SERVICES; AND**

8 **(IV) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES;**

9 **(5) THE PRODUCTION, PROCESSING, AND DISTRIBUTION OF ENERGY**
10 **RESOURCES, INCLUDING:**

11 **(I) SOLAR ENERGY;**

12 **(II) FUEL PRODUCED FROM ORGANIC MATERIAL, INCLUDING**
13 **WOOD, WASTES, PETROLEUM, COAL, AND NATURAL GAS;**

14 **(III) GEOTHERMAL ENERGY;**

15 **(IV) NUCLEAR ENERGY; AND**

16 **(V) ELECTRICAL ENERGY, OTHER THAN ELECTRICAL ENERGY**
17 **PRODUCED USING PETROLEUM-BASED FUELS;**

19 **FACILITIES NECESSARY TO SUPPORT PASSENGER TRANSPORTATION SERVICES,**

1 **(8) SANITATION SERVICES, INCLUDING THE COLLECTION AND**
2 **DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTES BY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ENTITIES AND THE**
3 **MAINTENANCE, OPERATION, AND REPAIR OF LIQUID PURIFICATION AND WASTE**
4 **FACILITIES;**

5 **(9) THE OPERATION OF PROGRAMS TO PROVIDE ESSENTIAL HEALTH**
6 **AND WELFARE SERVICES BY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE NONPROFIT SOCIAL SERVICES**
7 **AGENCIES;**

8 **(10) SPACE HEATING FOR MEDICAL AND NURSING BUILDINGS; AND**

9 **(11) TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICES, INCLUDING THE EMERGENCY**
10 **OR ESSENTIAL INSTALLATION, REPAIR, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF VOICE,**
11 **DATA, TELEGRAPH, VIDEO, AND SIMILAR COMMUNICATION SERVICES TO THE**
12 **PUBLIC BY A COMMUNICATIONS COMMON CARRIER.**

13 **(B) IF STATE FUEL SECURITY VOLUMES ARE NOT SUFFICIENT TO SATISFY**
14 **ALL REQUESTS FOR ASSIGNMENTS FOR ACTIVITIES PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION**
15 **(A) OF THIS SECTION, THE ADMINISTRATION MAY SET PRIORITIES FOR MAKING**
16 **ASSIGNMENTS.**

17 **14-505.**

18 **(A) (1) EACH PRIME SUPPLIER SHALL DESIGNATE A REPRESENTATIVE**
19 **WITH FULL AUTHORITY TO ACT ON BEHALF OF THE PRIME SUPPLIER WITH RESPECT**
20 **TO ASSIGNMENTS AND APPLICATIONS FOR ASSIGNMENTS.**

21 **(2) TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT FEASIBLE, THE ADMINISTRATION**
22 **SHALL CONSULT WITH THE REPRESENTATIVE OF A PRIME SUPPLIER BEFORE**
23 **ISSUING AN ASSIGNMENT THAT AFFECTS THE AMOUNT OF STATE FUEL SECURITY**
24 **PRODUCT TO BE SUPPLIED BY THE PRIME SUPPLIER.**

25 **(B) (1) DURING AN ENERGY EMERGENCY, A PERSON ENGAGED IN AN**
26 **ACTIVITY DESCRIBED IN § 14-504 OF THIS SUBTITLE MAY REQUEST AN ASSIGNMENT**
27 **BY SUBMITTING AN APPLICATION IN A FORM DETERMINED BY THE**
28 **ADMINISTRATION.**

29 **(2) ON APPROVAL OF AN APPLICATION, THE ADMINISTRATION**
30 **SHALL:**

31 **(I) ISSUE AN ASSIGNMENT TO THE APPLICANT; AND**

1 **(II) PROVIDE A COPY OF THE ASSIGNMENT TO THE DESIGNATED**
2 **REPRESENTATIVE OF THE PRIME SUPPLIER.**

3 **(3) AN ASSIGNMENT IS EFFECTIVE ON ISSUANCE AND CONSTITUTES**
4 **AN ENCUMBRANCE ON THE PRIME SUPPLIER'S STATE FUEL SECURITY VOLUMES FOR**
5 **THE MONTH OF ISSUANCE REGARDLESS OF THE ACTUAL DATE OF DELIVERY OF THE**
6 **STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT TO THE APPLICANT.**

7 **(4) AN ASSIGNMENT EXPIRES AUTOMATICALLY UNLESS THE**
8 **APPLICANT PRESENTS IT TO A SUPPLIER WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER ISSUANCE.**

9 **(C) (1) ON PRESENTATION OF AN ASSIGNMENT, THE SUPPLIER SHALL**
10 **SUPPLY TO THE APPLICANT THE ASSIGNED AMOUNT OF THE STATE FUEL SECURITY**
11 **PRODUCT.**

12 **(2) A DESIGNATED WHOLESALE PURCHASER-RESELLER OF A PRIME**
13 **SUPPLIER:**

14 **(I) SHALL HONOR ASSIGNMENTS ON PRESENTATION; AND**

15 **(II) MAY NOT DELAY DELIVERY WHILE CONFIRMING THE**
16 **ASSIGNMENT WITH THE PRIME SUPPLIER.**

17 **(D) (1) IF A SUPPLIER OTHER THAN A PRIME SUPPLIER SUPPLIES A**
18 **STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT IN ACCORDANCE WITH AN ASSIGNMENT, THE**
19 **SUPPLIER SHALL RECEIVE FROM ITS SUPPLIER AN EQUIVALENT VOLUME OF THE**
20 **STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT.**

21 **(2) THE VOLUME OF A STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT RECEIVED BY**
22 **A SUPPLIER FROM ITS SUPPLIER UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY**
23 **NOT BE CONSIDERED PART OF THE ALLOCATION THAT WOULD OTHERWISE HAVE**
24 **BEEN SUPPLIED TO THE SUPPLIER DURING THE SAME PERIOD.**

25 **(E) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY DIRECT THAT A WHOLESALE**
26 **PURCHASER-RESELLER BE SUPPLIED UNDER THE PROGRAM SO THAT THE**
27 **WHOLESALE PURCHASER-RESELLER IS ABLE TO SUPPLY INDIVIDUAL CONSUMERS**
28 **WHO WOULD OTHERWISE BE ELIGIBLE FOR AN ASSIGNMENT UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.**

30 **(A) AN APPLICANT OR A SUPPLIER MAY APPEAL TO THE DIRECTOR A**
31 **DECISION BY THE ADMINISTRATION ON AN APPLICATION FOR AN ASSIGNMENT.**

1 (B) AN APPEAL UNDER THIS SECTION:

2 (1) IS NOT SUBJECT TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT; AND

3 (2) SHALL BE RESOLVED INFORMALLY, EXPEDITIOUSLY, AND
4 INEXPENSIVELY.

5 (C) THE DECISION OF THE DIRECTOR IS THE FINAL AGENCY DECISION FOR
6 PURPOSES OF JUDICIAL REVIEW.

7 14-507.

8 (A) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY ALLOW THE RELEASE OF ALL OR PART OF A
9 PRIME SUPPLIER'S STATE FUEL SECURITY VOLUME INTO THE PRIME SUPPLIER'S
10 NORMAL STATEWIDE DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM.

11 (B) (1) DURING AN ENERGY EMERGENCY, THE GOVERNOR BY EXECUTIVE
12 ORDER MAY DESIGNATE CERTAIN GEOGRAPHIC AREAS IN THE STATE AS SUFFERING
13 FROM AN INTRASTATE SUPPLY IMBALANCE.

14 (2) AT ANY TIME DURING AN ENERGY EMERGENCY, THE
15 ADMINISTRATION BY WRITTEN ORDER MAY REQUIRE A PRIME SUPPLIER TO
16 RELEASE ALL OR PART OF ITS STATE FUEL SECURITY VOLUME INTO AN AREA
17 DESIGNATED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION THROUGH ITS NORMAL
18 DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM.

19 (3) AN ORDER ISSUED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION:

20 (I) IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY ON RECEIPT BY THE
21 DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE OF THE PRIME SUPPLIER; AND

22 (II) CONSTITUTES AN ENCUMBRANCE ON THE PRIME
23 SUPPLIER'S STATE FUEL SECURITY VOLUME FOR THE MONTH OF ISSUANCE
24 REGARDLESS OF THE ACTUAL DATE OF DELIVERY OF THE STATE FUEL SECURITY
25 PRODUCT.

26 14-508.

27 THE STATE FUEL SECURITY VOLUMES FOR A PARTICULAR MONTH:

28 (1) MAY NOT BE ACCUMULATED OR DEFERRED; AND

1 **(2) SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE FROM THE STOCKS OF PRIME**
2 **SUPPLIERS DIRECTLY OR THROUGH THEIR WHOLESALE PURCHASER-RESELLERS.**

3 **14-509.**

4 **(A) WITHIN 120 DAYS AFTER THE END OF A FISCAL YEAR WHEN THE**
5 **ADMINISTRATION USES THE PROGRAM, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL REPORT TO**
6 **THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, SUBJECT TO § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT**
7 **ARTICLE, ON THE PROGRAM.**

8 **(B) THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE A**
9 **DESCRIPTION OF THE NUMBER AND TYPES OF APPLICATIONS FOR EACH STATE FUEL**
10 **SECURITY PRODUCT RECEIVED AND APPROVED BY THE ADMINISTRATION DURING**
11 **THAT FISCAL YEAR.**

13 **(A) TO CARRY OUT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE**
14 **ADMINISTRATION:**

15 **(1) MAY COLLECT ENERGY-RELATED DATA IN ORDER TO INFORM**
16 **EVALUATIONS AND DECISIONS REGARDING ENERGY BY THE ADMINISTRATION,**
17 **STATE AND FEDERAL AGENCIES, AND, SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF**
18 **SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE PUBLIC;**

19 **(2) MAY MAINTAIN UP-TO-DATE REPORTS ON THE SUPPLY, DEMAND,**
20 **AND PRICE OF VARIOUS ENERGY RESOURCES, INCLUDING:**

21 **(I) WHOLESALE ELECTRICITY, INCLUDING ELECTRICITY**
22 **GENERATED FROM:**

23 1. **NUCLEAR GENERATION;**

24 2. **SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC TECHNOLOGY; AND**

25 3. **WIND, INCLUDING OFFSHORE WIND;**

26 **(II) COAL;**

27 **(III) NATURAL GAS;**

28 **(IV) PROPANE; AND**

1 (V) PETROLEUM;

2 (3) WHEN FEASIBLE, SHALL PROVIDE AN ANALYSIS OF THE
3 AVAILABILITY OF VARIOUS ENERGY RESOURCES, INCLUDING A FORECAST OF THE
4 FUTURE DEMAND FOR AND AVAILABILITY OF THOSE RESOURCES; AND

5 (4) SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY
6 MANAGEMENT TO DEVELOP AN INFORMATION DISTRIBUTION PLAN TO
7 DISSEMINATE ENERGY-RELATED INFORMATION TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC AND
8 RELEVANT STATE AND FEDERAL AGENCIES.

9 (B) (1) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE
10 DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY TO ENSURE THAT DATA COLLECTED
11 UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(1) OF THIS SECTION IS TRANSMITTED AND HELD SECURELY.

12 (2) (I) DATA DISSEMINATED TO THE PUBLIC UNDER SUBSECTION
13 (A)(4) OF THIS SECTION MAY NOT CREATE A COMPETITIVE ADVANTAGE FOR OR
14 DISADVANTAGE TO THE PERSON WHO SUPPLIED THE ENERGY-RELATED DATA.

15 (II) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL MAINTAIN THE
16 CONFIDENTIALITY OF ALL DATA THAT MAY CREATE A COMPETITIVE ADVANTAGE OR
17 DISADVANTAGE THAT IS UNKNOWN TO COMPETITORS.

18 (C) IN MAINTAINING THE REPORTS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A)(2) OF
19 THIS SECTION, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL USE DATA AVAILABLE FROM EXISTING
20 STATE AND FEDERAL SOURCES TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE.

21 (D) IN ORDER TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, THE
22 ADMINISTRATION MAY REQUIRE A PRIME SUPPLIER, SUPPLIER, OR WHOLESALE
23 PURCHASER-RESELLER TO PROVIDE NECESSARY INFORMATION IN A FORM

26 (A) (1) A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY VIOLATE OR KNOWINGLY
27 PARTICIPATE IN A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE OR A RULE OR REGULATION
28 ADOPTED UNDER IT.

29 (2) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SUBSECTION IS GUILTY OF A
30 MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT
31 EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR BOTH.

1 **(B) (1) IN ADDITION TO ANY PENALTY ASSESSED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)**
2 **OF THIS SECTION, IF THE DIRECTOR FINDS THAT A SUPPLIER HAS REFUSED TO**
3 **SUPPLY A STATE FUEL SECURITY PRODUCT AS REQUIRED BY AN ASSIGNMENT**
4 **UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, THE DIRECTOR MAY REFER THE MATTER TO THE ATTORNEY**
5 **GENERAL FOR CIVIL ENFORCEMENT.**

6 **(2) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY SUE FOR AND A COURT MAY**
7 **GRANT IMPOSITION OF A CIVIL PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$10,000 PER**
8 **OCCURRENCE PER DAY, APPROPRIATE EQUITABLE RELIEF, OR BOTH.**
