
1 AN ACT concerning

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Election Law - Postelection Tabulation Audits - Risk-Limiting Audits

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Elections, in collaboration with the local 4 boards of elections, to conduct a risk-limiting audit after each statewide election; 5 authorizing, rather than requiring, the State Board, in collaboration with the local 6 boards, to conduct an automated software audit after a statewide election; repealing 7 a requirement to conduct a manual audit after each statewide general election; 8 requiring the State Board, in collaboration with certain local boards, to conduct pilot 9 risk-limiting audits after a certain statewide general election; and generally relating to postelection tabulation audits. 10

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 18 Article Election Law
- 19 11–309.
- 20 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 21 (2) "AUTOMATED SOFTWARE AUDIT" MEANS AN AUDIT OF
- 22 ELECTRONIC IMAGES OF BALLOTS CAST IN AN ELECTION USING SOFTWARE THAT IS
- 23 INDEPENDENT OF THE VOTING SYSTEM.

- 1 (3) "ELECTRONIC COUNT" MEANS THE VOTE TOTALS PRODUCED BY 2 THE VOTING SYSTEM.
- [(2)] (4) "Manual [audit"] COUNT" means inspection of voter-verifiable paper records by hand and eye to obtain vote totals in a contest [that are compared to the vote totals produced for that contest by the electronic voting system].
- 6 [(3) "Previous comparable general election" means:
- 7 (i) in a presidential election year, the presidential election held 4 8 years earlier; and
- 9 (ii) in a gubernatorial election year, the gubernatorial election held 10 4 years earlier.]
- 11 (5) "RISK LIMIT" MEANS THE SMALL, PREDETERMINED MAXIMUM
 12 CHANCE THAT A RISK-LIMITING AUDIT WILL NOT REQUIRE A FULL MANUAL COUNT
 13 OF VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER RECORDS IN AN AUDITED CONTEST IF A FULL
 14 MANUAL COUNT OF THE VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER RECORDS WOULD FIND A
 15 DIFFERENT OUTCOME THAN THE OUTCOME DETERMINED BY THE ELECTRONIC
 16 COUNT.
- "RISK-LIMITING AUDIT" 17 **(6)** MEANS A POSTELECTION AUDIT 18 PROCEDURE THAT EMPLOYS STATISTICAL METHODS TO ENSURE A LARGE, 19 PREDETERMINED MINIMUM CHANCE OF REQUIRING A FULL MANUAL COUNT OF 20 VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER RECORDS IN AN AUDITED CONTEST IF A FULL MANUAL 21 COUNT OF THE VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER RECORDS WOULD FIND A DIFFERENT 22OUTCOME THAN THE OUTCOME DETERMINED BY THE ELECTRONIC COUNT.
- [(4)] (7) "Voter-verifiable paper record" has the meaning stated in § 24 9-102 of this article.
- [(b) Following each statewide general election, the State Board shall conduct an audit of the accuracy of the voting system's tabulation of votes by completing:
- 27 (1) an automated software audit of the electronic images of all ballots cast 28 in the election; and
- 29 (2) a manual audit of voter-verifiable paper records in accordance with 30 subsection (d) of this section.
- 31 (c) Following each statewide primary election, the State Board:
- 32 (1) shall complete an automated software audit of the electronic images of 33 all ballots cast in the election; and



1 An audit under this section: (e) 2 may not have any effect on the certified election results; and (1) 3 (2) shall be used to improve the voting system and voting process for future 4 elections. FOLLOWING EACH STATEWIDE ELECTION, THE STATE BOARD, IN 5 (B) **(1)** 6 COLLABORATION WITH THE LOCAL BOARDS, SHALL AUDIT THE ACCURACY OF THE VOTING SYSTEM'S TABULATION OF VOTES BY COMPLETING A RISK-LIMITING AUDIT 7 8 OF: 9 (I)AT LEAST ONE STATEWIDE CONTEST; 10 (II) AT LEAST ONE LOCAL CONTEST IN EACH COUNTY, WHICH MAY BE A COUNTYWIDE CONTEST OR A LOCAL CONTEST ON THE BALLOT IN PART OF 11 12 A COUNTY; AND 13 (III) ANY OTHER CONTESTS SELECTED FOR AUDIT BY THE STATE 14 BOARD. **(2)** 15 **(I)** SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE STATE BOARD SHALL SELECT THE SPECIFIC CONTESTS TO BE AUDITED UNDER 16 17 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION. 18 A CONTEST FOR AN OFFICE FOR WHICH THE TERM BEGINS (II)19 IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER MAY NOT BE SELECTED FOR AUDIT UNLESS THE 20 ELECTION DIRECTOR FOR THE COUNTY AGREES TO AUDIT THE CONTEST. 21 **(3)** A RISK-LIMITING AUDIT SHALL: 22MANUALLY EXAMINE RANDOMLY CHOSEN INDIVIDUAL **(I)** 23VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER RECORDS OR BATCHES OF VOTER-VERIFIABLE PAPER 24 RECORDS UNTIL THE MAXIMUM CHANCE OF A FULL MANUAL COUNT FINDING A 25 DIFFERENT OUTCOME THAN THE OUTCOME DETERMINED BY THE ELECTRONIC 26COUNT IS NO LARGER THAN THE RISK LIMIT, OR UNTIL THERE HAS BEEN A FULL MANUAL COUNT; 27 28 (II)BE COMPLETED BEFORE CERTIFICATION OF THE ELECTION 29 **RESULTS; AND** 30 (III) BE OBSERVABLE BY THE PUBLIC TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT 31 PRACTICABLE.

1 IF A RISK-LIMITING AUDIT FINDS THAT THE ELECTION OUTCOME **(4)** 2 DETERMINED BY THE ELECTRONIC COUNT IS INCORRECT, THE OFFICIAL RESULT OF 3 THE ELECTION SHALL BE ALTERED TO MATCH THE OUTCOME DETERMINED BY THE 4 RISK-LIMITING AUDIT. 5 **(5)** WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE RISK-LIMITING 6 AUDIT, THE STATE BOARD SHALL POST ON THE STATE BOARD'S WEBSITE A REPORT 7 THAT DESCRIBES THE AUDIT PROCESS AND THE RESULTS OF THE AUDIT. 8 (C) IN ADDITION TO THE RISK-LIMITING AUDIT REQUIRED UNDER 9 SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE LOCAL BOARDS, MAY CONDUCT AN AUTOMATED SOFTWARE AUDIT AFTER A 10 STATEWIDE ELECTION THAT INCLUDES NOT MORE THAN 25% OF THE BALLOT 11 STYLES USED IN THAT ELECTION. 12 13 [(f)] **(**D**) (1)** The State Board shall adopt regulations to carry out this section. 14 **(2)** THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 15 SUBSECTION TO CARRY OUT RISK-LIMITING AUDITS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE: 16 17 **(I)** CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING THE CONTESTS TO BE 18 **AUDITED**; 19 (II) THE RISK LIMIT; AND 20 (III) THE AUDIT METHOD. 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That: 22Following the statewide general election in November 2022, the State Board of Elections, in collaboration with the appropriate local boards of elections, shall conduct 23 pilot risk-limiting audits in at least two counties of at least two contests on the November 242022 general election ballot. 25 26 The State Board shall: (b) 27 (1) select the contests to be audited; and determine how the pilot risk-limiting audits are to be conducted. 28(2)29 A pilot risk-limiting audit: (c) 30 (1)may be conducted in whole or in part after the election results are

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certified; and

- 1 (2) may not have any effect on the certified election results.
- 2 (d) On or before December 1, 2023, the State Board shall submit a report on the 3 pilot risk-limiting audits to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs 4 Committee and the House Ways and Means Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the 5 State Government Article.
- 6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall take 7 effect January 1, 2023.
- 8 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section 9 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
