

25	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
26	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:



- Article Agriculture 1 2 8-801. 3 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. **(1)** EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF 4 (n) SUBSECTION, "WATERS OF THE STATE" has the meaning stated in § 5-101 of the 5 6 Environment Article. 7 **(2)** "Waters of the State" DOES NOT INCLUDE: 8 UNDERGROUND WATERS WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF (I)9 THE STATE THAT ARE SUBJECT TO ITS JURISDICTION; OR 10 (II) A FLOODPLAIN OF FREE-FLOWING WATERS AS11 DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT ON THE BASIS OF 12 THE 100-YEAR FLOOD FREQUENCY. 13 8-803.4. 14 (e) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a professional fertilizer applicator may not apply fertilizer containing phosphorus or 15 nitrogen to turf that is within 15 feet of waters of the State. 16 17 When a drop spreader, rotary spreader with a deflector, or targeted 18 spray liquid is used for fertilizer application, the setback required under paragraph (1) 19 of this subsection may be reduced to 10 feet. 20 The establishment of setbacks for fertilizer application under this (3) 21subsection does not preclude the establishment or applicability of, or compliance with, 22any other environmental standards established under any other State or federal law, 23rule, or regulation. 24 The penalty imposed on a person under this section shall be assessed 25 with consideration given to: 26 The willfulness of the violation, the extent to which the existence of 27 the violation was known to the violator but uncorrected by the violator, and the extent 28to which the violator exercised reasonable care;
- 29 (2) Any actual harm to human health or to the environment including 30 injury to or impairment of the use of the waters of the State or the natural resources of the State;
 - (3) The cost of control;

3	(iii) All applicable State and federal laws, rules, and regulations;
4 5	(iv) The correct interpretation of fertilizer labeling information; and
6 7	(v) The recommendations developed by the University of Maryland for nutrient management on turf, including the appropriate time to:
8	1. Apply fertilizer when rain is forecast; and
9 10	2. Apply fertilizer when soils are wet and the potential for fertilizer movement off–site exists.

12 13 14 15	(c) The University of Maryland shall review its fertilizer turf guidelines every 3 years and revise the guidelines as necessary, with consideration of plant nutrient requirements and established State goals to protect water quality in the waters of the State.
16 17 18 19	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013, the effective date of Chapters 484 and 485 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2011. If the effective dates of Chapters 484 and 485 are amended, this Act shall take effect on the taking effect of Chapters 484 and 485.
