- 17 (a) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a personal representative or trustee 18 may make an irrevocable transfer to another adult or trust company as custodian for the 19 benefit of a minor pursuant to § 13–309 of this subtitle, in the absence of a will or under a 20 will or trust that does not contain an authorization to do so.
- 21 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a conservator may make an irrevocable 22 transfer to another adult or trust company as custodian for the benefit of the minor 23 pursuant to § 13–309 of this subtitle.

SENATE BILL 75

- 1 (c) A transfer under subsection (a) or (b) of this section may be made only if:
- 2 (1) The personal representative, trustee, or conservator considers the 3 transfer to be in the best interest of the minor;
- 4 (2) The transfer is not prohibited by or inconsistent with provisions of the applicable will, trust agreement, or other governing instrument; and
- 6 (3) The transfer is authorized by the court if it exceeds [\$10,000] **\$50,000** 7 in value.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2024.
