1 AN ACT concerning

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Higher Education - Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program - Established

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program; stating the 4 purposes of the Program; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission to 5 administer the Program, develop a certain form, and designate certain campuses at 6 certain public institutions of higher education as hunger-free campuses using 7 certain criteria; authorizing certain public institutions of higher education to develop 8 certain procedures; requiring certain public institutions of higher education to make 9 certain information publicly available; requiring the Governor, beginning in a certain fiscal year, to include in the annual budget bill a certain appropriation for 10 the Program; requiring the Commission to allocate grant funding to certain public 11 12 institutions of higher education; requiring the Commission to determine the amount 13 of grant funding to each eligible public institution of higher education; requiring the 14 Commission to include a certain plan in a certain strategic plan; requiring the Commission to adopt certain regulations to carry out the requirements of this Act; 15 16 requiring the Commission to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on 17 the implementation of this Act within a certain time period; defining certain terms; 18 and generally relating to the Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program.
