SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 Article – Health – General

- 5 (a) (1) The Secretary shall administer the Maryland Medical Assistance 6 Program.
- 7 (2) The Program:
- 8 (xvi) Beginning on January 1, 2021, shall provide, subject to the 9 limitations of the State budget and § 15–855(b)(2) of the Insurance Article, and as permitted by federal law, services for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated 10 11 with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, 12including the use of intravenous immunoglobulin therapy, for eligible Program recipients, 13 if pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections 14 and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome are coded for billing and diagnosis purposes in accordance with § 15–855(d) of the Insurance Article; [and] 15
- 16 (xvii) Beginning on January 1, 2022, may not include, subject to federal 17 approval and limitations of the State budget, a frequency limitation on covered dental 18 prophylaxis care or oral health exams that requires the dental prophylaxis care or oral 19 health exams to be provided at an interval greater than 120 days within a plan year; AND
- 20 (XVIII) SHALL PROVIDE, SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS OF
 21 THE STATE BUDGET, COMPREHENSIVE MEDICAL CARE AND OTHER HEALTH CARE
 22 SERVICES TO NONCITIZEN PREGNANT WOMEN WHO WOULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE
 23 PROGRAM BUT FOR THEIR IMMIGRATION STATUS AND TO THEIR CHILDREN UP TO
 24 THE AGE OF 1 YEAR.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, in implementing the requirements of Section 1 of this Act, the Maryland Department of Health shall apply for the waiver from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that maximizes federal funding and the individuals who would be eligible for the Maryland Medical Assistance Program benefit required under Section 1 of this Act.
- 30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
